Editor, and everyone else for their hard work in publishing this outstanding work. A large "void" in our communication between compatriots, chapters and the state has been eliminated!

Hopefully, most of you have received you hardcopy newsletter by now. If so, I want you to compare your hardcopy issue to the digital newsletter posted on the state website. There is no comparison is there? Another testament to the current digital issue posted on the website is, "it is almost free" to the State Society. That is because we have some software and server costs.

With that said, let me give you some idea of the costs associated with issuing our hardcopy newsletter to all State Society Compatriots. The printing and mailing cost for the winter

2008-2009, issue hardcopy version was \$2,282.33. That is just one issue; we produce four (4) issues per. Today, all costs are going up; printing, postage, and even National are considering raising dues. If we could reduce the printing and mailing cost to some agreeable level by reducing the number of hardcopy newsletters produced, we could hopefully hold State dues constant as they are today.

I have been visiting our chapters across the state over the last year, and I have taken every opportunity to tell those compatriots about the State Society's efforts to begin utilizing the website for their newsletter instead of receiving a hardcopy through the mail.

In today's economic environment we need to make sound business cost decisions in conducting the business of the State Society. The advantages of a digital Texas Compatriot posted on the state website would reduce the printing and mailing costs to the State Society, digitally capable compatriots would be able to receive the newsletter in full, vivid color very quickly once it is posted on the site. It is the most effi-

cient and expeditious vehicle for delivering the newsletter to the membership. *We would like for all Compatriots that are digitally capable to please consider using the website for their newsletter instead of receiving a hardcopy as a means of reducing some of our rising expenses.* All hardcopy newsletters will still be in black and white and will be received by mail at a later date due to a "postalization" check for valid addresses, printing time and mailing delays.

I want to thank all Texas Society Compatriots for their patience and understanding and for bearing with us during the gap in the production of the Texas Compatriot during the year. We are back producing a quality product that all can appreciate.

Thank all of you for your support during my term and I hope to see many of you at the State Conference in Nacogdoches. We are planning a great event for all to enjoy.
