Charles McBarron, depicts the victorious assault on Yorktown Redoubt 10, led by Lieutenant Colonel Hamilton. The taking of Redoubts 9 and 10 enabled General George Washington to complete the siege lines surrounding Yorktown and force the surrender of Lord Cornwallis. This British defeat ultimately ended the Revolutionary War and secured the independence and formation of our United States. We proudly honor our chapter's namesake!

Michael is the Guadalupe County Commissioner and he spoke about the many significant events that were happening in the original colonies in 1776. He read excepts from several letters and other writings of various people that have been discovered, preserved and published from that period.

We Alexander Hamilton Chapter members reached our 15th anniversary this Spring.

Our SAR Alexander Hamilton Chapter in Georgetown, Texas is one of 48 Texas Chapters. Our original Chapter included a group that split off from The Patrick Henry Chapter in Austin. The Alexander Hamilton's Chapter Chartering Ceremony took place on Saturday, May 23rd, 2009 at the Masonic Lodge at 900 North College Street, Georgetown, Texas.

In 2009, the first Officers included: President Harlan Green, Treasurer Reese Henry, and Chaplin David Kirkland.

By 2011, The Chapter had grown to 42 members and Donald Bunnell was the President, Paul Swetland was the President-Elect, Bill Freemen was the Treasurer, William Towery was Secretary, David Kirkland was Chaplin, Harold Walden was Registrar and Jim Scott was Historian.

In 2013-2014 Ray DeVries was elected President, Jim Scott was President-Elect, Dan Stauffer was Registrar, Bill Freemen was Treasurer, Mike Nichols was Chaplin, Rick Mallery was Secretary, David Kirkland was Sergeant-at-Arms, and Roger Gore was Historian.

We are grateful to all these founders who allowed us to have this local chapter and especially to Jim Scott (now Color Guard) who is still serving after all these years.
