

Americanism

An informative and entertaining presentation on our "FIRST MEDAL", a badge of merit was given by Compatriot Glenn Toal. He noted that General George Washington wanted





to reward troops for "unusual gallantry" and "extraordinary fidelity and essential service." The award was a purple cloth heart edged in silver braid, and was to be worn over the left breast of the uniform. Only three awards are known to have been issued, of which two are known to exist today.

This original <u>Badge of Military Merit</u> is now called the *PURPLE HEART* and is a United States military decoration awarded in the name of the

President to those wounded or killed while serving, on or after April 5, 1917, with the U.S. military.

GUEST SPEAKER

Dallas Chapter Compatriot Joshua C. Tate, >
an Associate Professor at the SMU Dedman School of Law
presented a very informative history on "The Grand Jury Right"
and "Magna Carta and the Fifth Amendment."
The 1780 U.S. Constitution Amendment V states that no person


The 1789 U.S. Constitution, Amendment V states that <u>no person</u> shall be held to answer for a capital, or otherwise infamous crime unless on a presentment or indictment of a grand jury, except in cases arising in the land or navel forces, or in the militia, when in actual service in time of war or public danger......



Prof. Tate concluded his detailed narrative by noting the grand jury was created 850 years ago to gather information about suspected criminals in the absence of professional police. Whatever may be said about today's grand jury, it certainly does not serve its original purpose, however, it would be wise to consider the history of the institution in making arguments about its recent controversies and possible elimination or reform.
