LIBRARY CONTRIBUTIONS



he National Society has received a very large collection of historical documents. The volume of documents is far greater than the present library facilities can accommodate, requiring a considerable expansion of the library. NSSAR will be mailing brochures soliciting donations to the expansion program. The TXSSAR Members of the Library Expansion Committee feel that the Texas Society, being the largest Society, should receive recognition for our efforts in the form of some area, or section, to be designated to honor Texas efforts.

If TXSSAR decides that we want our Society's contributions to be credited to a specific part of the building, i.e., a room to be named the "Texas Room," we must establish what contributions to the program were made by our members. Since NSSAR does not plan to do groupings by State Societies, the TXSSAR Library Special Committee is proposing that all donations, anonymous and others, (bricks, cookbooks, etc.) be sent to the TXSSAR Treasurer. The Treasurer will maintain a total of the dollars contributed, or pledged, and then forward the campaign form and check to the SAR Foundation. No names will be recorded by the Treasurer to insure anonymity for those who desire to remain anonymous.


