## Dallas Chapter at the 116th Congress

The 116th Congress of the S.A.R. has ended, marking the 100th anniversary of our great organization. The delegates and guests were treated to a rodeo, a barbeque, city tours of Dallas, Fort Worth, and the Gaylord Texan in addition to two formal banquets, and exposure to the Dallas and Addison restaurant scene. (Our town has the highest per capita number of restaurants in the Nation.)

The Dallas Chapter won the President General's 2005 Activities Award for showing evidence of the most complete practice of implementing SAR programs and resolutions. There was also national recognition in the area of Veteran's Affairs.

Compatriot Nathan White of the Plano Chapter was duly installed as President General. He and Wanda did a superb job of creating Texana atmosphere among the delegates and guests. Chapter members Coker, Slagle, Whitelock, and Baker were individually recognized for their contributions, and Nathan personally thanked the Dallas Chapter for the time and effort many members contributed to the Congress.

A special "thank you" to those members and wives who answered the call to serve as drivers to the barbeque and those who served as greeters and hosts at the welcome and registration tables.

Other highlights and developments:

- 1. Dallas Police Chief David M. Kunkle was awarded the S.A.R. Law Enforcement Award.
- 2. The SAR owns George Washington's gold ring, and it was brought out of the vault for the Wednesday banquet.
- 3. Dual member Chuck Bragg was elected Genealogist General.
- 5. Compatriot Bob Clark has assumed the TXSSAR Chancellor's position previously held by Past President Mark Hansen.
- 6. Dallas Chapter Poster Contest winner Sara Ludlow's poster won 3rd place in the National judging.




