The 2500-pound replica of the Liberty Bell, the trailer, and the truck were provided by David Hall, owner of the Bell. The replica of the American Revolutionary War cannon (shown in pictures on P. 3) was provided by the Plano Chapter with the help of Cannon master Dan Reed. The flintlocks carried by Tracy Pounders and Bob Northcraft were provided by the Dallas Chapter.

"Remember Pearl Harbor"

n this 65th anniversary of the Bombing of Pearl Harbor, we publish these never-before-seen photographs that were found in a Pearl Harbor Survivor's trunk after his death. At 0753 hours, the first wave of 40 Nakajima B5N2 "Kate" torpedo bombers, 51 Aichi D3A1 "Val" dive bombers, 50 high-altitude bombers, and 43 Zero fighters attacked U.S. Navy and other U.S. military installations at and near Pearl Harbor, Oahu, Hawaii. A total of 2403 U.S. military personnel were killed, many having been on the USS Arizona when its magazine explored following a direct hit, and 1178 U.S. military personnel were wounded.

The pictures below, clockwise starting at upper left: A Japanese Zero is seen surveying the damage following the first wave attack; the initial explosion that hit the USS Arizona; the explosion of the Arizona's magazine, causing the ship to sink immediately, carrying 1200 U.S.Navy personnel to their grave; and the USS Oklahoma capsizing and sinking. The second wave attack came about an hour later.

Total casualties in this attack were fewer then those of the 9-11-01 attacks, yet the Pearl Harbor attack plunged the U.S. into World War II which lasted over 3.5 years and left more than 500,000 U.S. military personnel dead, and between 40 and 50 million people dead in many countries.


