

Eighteen Bullets

by Dr. H. Charles Baker, President, Dallas Chapter, Sons of the American Revolution





The February Issue pointed out that these radical ideas had their roots in the surge of literacy in England that was brought on by William the Conqueror in the 11th Century. The April Issue discussed the development of the concept of elected representation.

A non-SAR friend recently surprised me by saying that had he lived during the Revolutionary Period, he is uncertain as to which side he would take. Weren't the "Patriots" merely a bunch of hotheads who overthrew legitimate rule to get power for themselves? I asked my friend whether he had ever read the Declaration of Independence. Obviously, his answer was negative.

Nevertheless, his question caused me to review the *Declaration of Independence*, which clearly states the reasons for such insolent behavior by our Founding Fathers. The Declaration actually presents 18 personal charges against King George III, any of which would be thought intolerable by Americans today.

- "He has refused his Assent to Laws ... necessary for the public good."
- "He has forbidden his Governors to pass Laws of immediate and pressing importance, unless suspended in their operation till his Assent should be obtained; and when so suspended, he has utterly neglected ... them."
- "He has refused to pass other Laws ... unless [the] people would give up their right of Representation in the legislature ... "
- "He has called together legislative bodies at places unusual, uncomfortable and distant ... "
- "He has dissolved Representative Houses repeatedly ..."
- "He has refused ... to cause others to be elected ... [to replace them]"
- "He has endeavored to prevent the Population of these States ... obstructing Laws of Naturalization of foreigners ... and raising the conditions of new Appropriation of Lands."
- "He has obstructed the Administration of Justice by refusing his Assent to Laws for establishing Judiciary Powers."
- "He has made Judges dependent on his Will alone, for tenure of their offices, and for the amount and payment of their salaries."
