### President's Message

ctober marks the 227th anniversary of the 1781
Siege known as the Battle of Yorktown. This Battle proved to be the decisive battle of the American Revolution. In one of history's rare successful French naval operations against the British Navy, the British Army under General Cornwallis was blocked from escape from General Washington's encirclement of the British on the Virginia coast. After Yorktown, the Americans picked off the remaining British garrisons over the next two years and American Independence was recognized by the September 3, 1783 Treaty of Paris.

We continue meeting at 8:00 a.m. the second Saturday of each month at the Highland Park Cafeteria in the Casa Linda Shopping Center. Our next regular meetings are the following Saturdays: November 8, December 13, and January 10. In September, a special meeting was held at the Presbyterian Village North after our regular meeting. A special dinner meeting will take place at the Radisson Hotel, 6060 N. Central Expy. This meeting will not replace our regular second-Saturday meeting on November 8.

In addition, a number of members attended the Texas Society's Board of Managers meeting this past August 1-3 in Tyler.

September also saw two significant Color Guard activities here in Dallas. First, on Tuesday, September 9, 2008, the Color Guard assisted the General George Washington Society – the fundraising arm of Thanksgiving Square in downtown Dallas – in greeting guests and leading the salute to the flag at the Dallas estate known as "Mount Vernon." This is the former home of H. L. Hunt on White Rock Lake. Mr. David Hall's traveling Liberty Bell was a hit at the event. Secondly, the Color Guard accompanied the Liberty Bell to Presbyterian Village North for a Constitution Day Celebration after our September meeting.

Commander Bob Northcraft continues to do a great job with our Color Guard.


#### **DINNER MEETING DETAILS**
