

be signed by every member of Congress. Engrossing meant that it was to be copied in handwriting larger than the original document. It was also given a new title "The Unanimous Declaration of the Thirteen United States of America". Previous to this date, the original version had only been signed by John Hancock, President of the Congress.

One hundred copies of the original document signed on July 4<sup>th</sup> were made by John Dunlap of Philadelphia and distributed. These "broadsides" were sent to state legislatures, newspapers, and deserving people throughout the colonies, including one copy to George Washington. It was this copy that General Washington ordered be read to the American Army on July 9<sup>th</sup>. Few people realize that one copy eventually found its way to Dallas and is located on the Seventh Floor of the Dallas Public Library. This is one of only 24 known to exist! I hope that each of you will make time soon for a short drive downtown to view this rare copy of one of the greatest documents ever written.



## Americanism Trivia Quiz (from May-June Issue):

1. Name the treaty that ended the French and Indian War, known in Europe as the Seven Years' War. What were the main provisions of this treaty. The Treaty of Paris signed on February 10, 1763 eliminated France as a contestant for the North American continent. France ceded Canada and all of its territory east of the Mississippi River. Only Spain, with territory west of the Mississippi, was left to challenge England.

2. Name the treaty that ended the American Revolutionary War. What were the main provisions of this treaty? The Treaty of Paris signed on September 3, 1783, established the boundaries of the U.S. as Canada to the north, Spanish Florida to the South, and the Mississippi River to the west. The U.S. would also maintain the right to fish off the coast of Newfoundland and Nova Scotia, and have the right of navigation on the Mississippi to the Caribbean Sea, (later renamed the Gulf of Mexico).

The year of 1781 did not start off well for the Continental Army. In January, there were mutinies among Continental Army units from two colonies. Which colonies were they, what were the issues, and what was the result?


