

Flag in front of the Hotel






Two very special items came out of the committee sessions;


#1 John Greer ^ proposed:

GUEST SPEAKER

Major General MARSHALL SCANTLIN

"I, ______, do solemnly swear (or affirm) that I will support and defend the Constitution of the United States against all enemies, foreign and domestic; that I will bear true faith and allegiance to the same; and that I will obey the orders of the President of the United States and the orders of the officers appointed over me, according to regulations and the Uniform Code of Military Justice. So help me God." Compatriot Scantlin emphasized that enlisted service men & women who (like himself) have felt it an honor to recite this oath that bonds them to all that served their country. The original version of that oath was first voted on 14 June 1775 as part of the act creating the Continental Army.

Tomorrow (Nov. 11th) we honor over twenty million living American veterans, and we continue the tradition established in 1918 of celebrating the end of WWI, starting our Dallas

Parade at the 11th hour on the 11th day of the 11th month. Veterans Day is the <u>one special day</u> (out of the many days of each year) that we salute & remember our veterans from times of war and times of peace. Remember that the history of the United States of America is about the *service and the sacrifice* for over two hundred & forty two years.



"All too often it takes a time of conflict to make us understand what service to our Country is all about – it takes the loss of a loved one to make us understand how deeply serious this business of keeping our Country free is...." We also need to remember that the families of service men & women likewise sacrifice and face an uncertain future.

In conclusion, Compatriot Scantlin read a lyric *In a Mother's Eye*, written by songwriter Andrew Dean, and it truly brought home for all to consider, that **FREEDOM IS NOT FREE**.






