Fellow Compatriots-In case you missed Brandon's email:

1) The District is gathering funds to contribute items to the Bonham VA clinic. They are asking for monetary donations so that they can buy whatever items Veterans may need this holiday season (Robes and items for a holiday party). Contact compatriot John Greer (johnlgreer@juno.com) to coordinate a personal donation to the District's cause. John will coordinate purchasing the items and transportation.

2) STARK Report. I received a note from state about completing our Chapter's annual report. Please keep any activities related to Veteran's affairs in mind and let Mike Connelley and myself know so that the data can be complied and reported up to the state. Specific categories of interest are as follows:

(1) **Memorial Services/Funerals** of any Veteran. Please send name of deceased veteran, date, location, your role if any, and distance (r/t) traveled.

(2) **Personal donations** (check/cash) to a Veterans Service organization, such as Wounded Warriors, VFW, USO, Paralyzed Vets, Purple Heart, American Legion, Camp Hope, Tunnel for Towers, etc. I will NEED amount, date of gift, and organization that received your gift. The key to their qualification is: Is the organization's primary client the Veteran? If yes, it qualifies. For every mile driven/flown to a funeral, one point is credited. For every dollar donated, one point is credited.

(3) **Donations of clothing** (new or used) to a Veterans Service organization, such as VFW, American Legion, Texas Paralyzed, Disabled Texas Veterans or Disabled American Veterans. Others are acceptable as well, **BUT** they must have *Veterans as the Primary client*. Please indicate date donated, organization name, and amount paid for new clothing (men or women). If donating used clothing, then credit is based on 1/3 of original price. For each dollar value of clothing donated, one point is credited.

(4) Wreaths Across America - Purchase of 3 wreaths for Wreaths Across America will make a Chapter qualified at 50 points minimum for their Stark report.

(5) **Personal cost incurred** for Wreaths, Flowers, or Flags placed on the Graves of any Veteran throughout the year. Note: For every dollar donated the Chapter is credited with one Point. For every mile driven or flown to a funeral, one point is credited.

Laying Out Washington D.C.



Genealogical Information in Unexpected Places: Letters to Santa



A delightful childhood tradition is writing letters to Santa Claus. Children's letters are full of wishes for toys, candy, or other much-dreamed-of items. But mingled among the requests for dolls and firecrackers you might find a few gems of genealogical information.

In Denton each December, children would write their letters to Santa and send them to the *Denton Record-Chronicle*. The editor published the letters in the newspaper and then would "send a copy of the paper to the North Pole for Santa to read." The letters are both predictable and surprising.

Letters may include the child's name, age, and address, as well as information about their close family members. In one example from 1915, Annie Laura Cannon mentions that members of her household have scarlet fever. "Dear Santa Claus: please bring me a bottle of perfume, a pretty doll, a little umbrella, a little sewing machine, a popcorn popper, a little piano, beauty pins, crochet hook, two packages of sparklers, oranges, apples, bananas, nuts of all kinds. Your little friend. P.S. – You need not bring us any candy. We are going to make our Christmas candy. We have the scarlet fever, and if you are afraid to come in, just leave the things on the front porch."

The children were aware of other people's hardships, often requesting gifts be sent to others that were in need. Benny Margaret Klepper wrote a letter in 1914 and mentions the death of one of her brothers and the name of an orphanage in Dallas.

"I want you to go to Buckner's Orphan Home and take all the little children something and be sure and go where they are playing war and take all the little children something. I have three brothers. Be sure and come to see them. One of my brothers is in heaven. Bring me something to go on his grave, and don't forget my mamma and papa, and if you have anything left, I would like a cow-girl suit and a sleepy doll. I go to Sunday school every Sunday and help mamma work. I thank you ever so much. You are so good, I know I will get all I ask for."

Occasionally people disappear from our family trees and leave no trace as to what happened to them. Sometimes these questions are never answered. But the letters to Santa could provide a clue. In Cate and Robert Maples' letter from in 1914 they refer to themselves as orphans, their mother dying "not long ago."

"We are two little orphan children. Our mamma is dead. She died not long ago. Send us anything you have for us. I guess Christmas will be dull with us so bring us some candy, fruit and nuts and anything else."

The "Letters to Santa," published in the *Denton Record-Chronicle*, from 1909 to 1923 have been indexed and transcribed and are available on the Denton Public Library's Genealogy Resources page under the <u>Newspapers</u> tab. The index lists: the name of the child who wrote the letter, their address (if given), the content of their letter, and the citation for the issue of the DRC in which it was printed.

As you research, remember to contact the institutions or organizations in the area where your ancestors lived. Libraries, societies, and archives may have resources like our Letters to Santa index containing genealogical gems for you.
