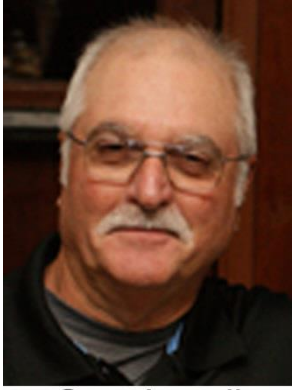

Please allow me to thank you one more time for the privilege of representing you these last two years. I have made acquaintances through the SAR that would have been impossible otherwise.

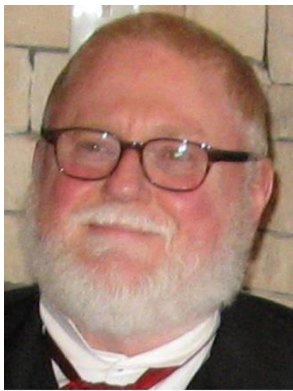

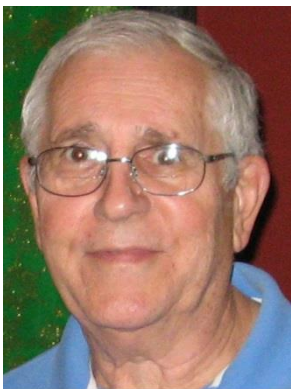

Della and I were blown around a little but we are fine. Thanks to all of you who have emailed and called. Looking forward to the New Year!

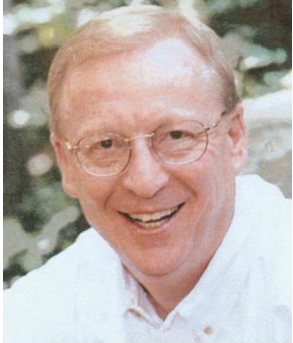

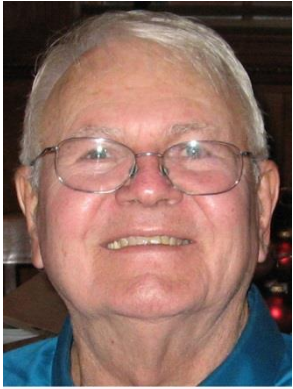
Color Guard Commander

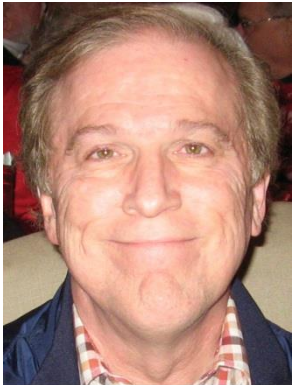

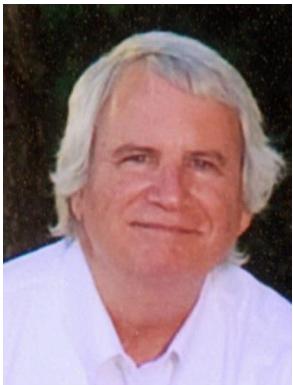

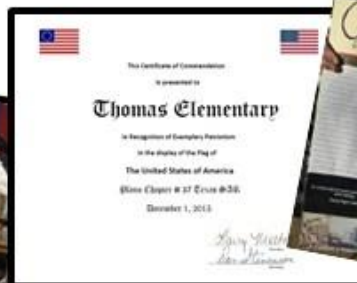
