



This Month during the Revolutionary War: The month of June during the Revolutionary War was a time of significant events and action. George Washington was named Commander in Chief of the Military on June 15, 1775. John Adams, Massachusetts, said "I had no hesitation to declare that I had but one gentleman in mind for that important position...." June 17, 1775 was the Battle of Bunker Hill. In June 1778, the British abandoned Philadelphia and returned to New York. June 28, 1778 saw the Battle of Monmouth Courthouse and on June 21, 1779, Spain declared war on Great Britain.
