VIRGINIA SOCIETY SAR ANNUAL MEETING

Two dual members of the Maj. K.M. Van Zandt Chapter participated in the Virginia SAR Annual Meeting on the weekend of February 7-9. Doug Schwetke participated in the Color Guard, and Bill Schwetke was installed as the 100th president of the Virginia SAR. One of the highlights of the Annual Meeting was the visit to the state capitol for the Memorial Service and the Public Service Award Ceremony. Both were held in the Old House Chamber. The Virginia General Assembly, originally the House of Burgesses, is the oldest elected legislative body in North America, having been meeting for 401 years. For the past 222 years the legislature has met in this building designed by Thomas Jefferson. The NSSAR Congress in Richmond July 11-15 will offer a tour of the capitol.

239TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE CROSSING OF THE DAN

On February 15th, 1781, General Greene successfully brought his army to safety across the rain swollen Dan River, and Virginians answered a call by Governor Patrick Henry by rushing to resupply and reinforce Greene's army. Just four days later, Greene's revitalized army again crossed the Dan, now seeking to confront Cornwallis. This would occur on March 16th at Guilford Courthouse, where Greene inflicted damage to Cornwallis' Army that set into motion the chain of events leading to victory at Yorktown.

At this year's 239th Anniversary Ceremony for this national NSSAR event, the Maj. K.M. Van Zandt wreath was presented by dual member Doug Schwetke and both Doug and his brother, Bill, participated in the Color Guard.

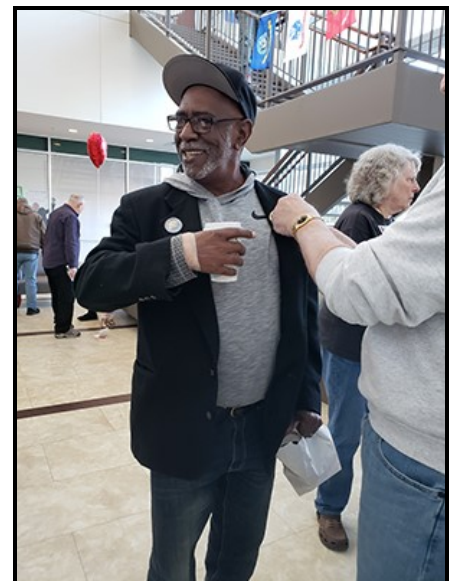


FORT WORTH VA OUTPATIENT CLINIC FEBRUARY 14, 2020

BRAZOS VALLEY CHAPTER INSTALLATION OF OFFICERS FEBRUARY 22, 2020

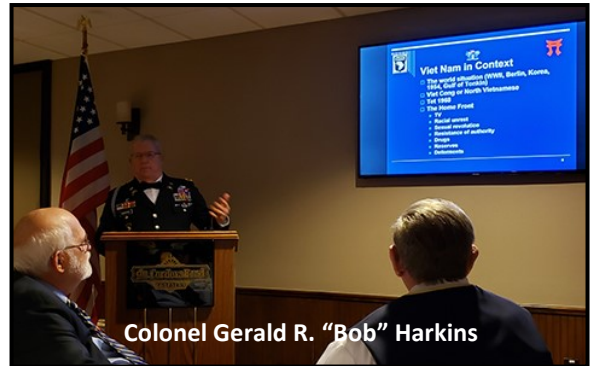
President Ron and First Lady Jan Turner, along with Compatriot James Alderman and his Lady, Ja Ann, were honored guests at the Installation of Officers Banquet for the Brazos Valley Chapter at the DeCordova Bend Country Club in Granbury.

The guest speaker was Colonel Gerald R. “Bob” Harkins, U.S. Army, Retired. Col. Harkins lives in Spring Branch, Texas, and is an active member of the Alexander Hamilton SAR Chapter. He was a young Lieutenant in Vietnam off and on from 1966 to 1969. He related his experiences leading an infantry platoon, especially during the Battle of Hamburger Hill in May 1969. The Brazos Valley Chapter presented Col. Harkins a prized wooden chest in which to store his Army memorabilia.

A highlight of the evening was honoring a Gold Star Family, Terry & Beth Burgess. Their son, SSgt. Bryan A. Burgess, a nine-year career soldier, of Cleburne, Texas, assigned to 2nd Battalion, 327th Infantry Regiment, 1st Brigade Combat Team, 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault), Fort Campbell, Kentucky, died March 29, 2011, at Bagram Airfield, Afghanistan, of wounds sustained after enemy forces attacked his unit with small-arms fire in Kunar province. Mr. Burgess spoke about their foundation, Gold Star Parents Retreat, which gathers together Texas Gold Star Parents to share their stories and to honor their sons and daughters in a retreat environment. Their goal is to never forget their children's sacrifice.

Brazos Valley Chapter President Jim Hanlon also presented the SAR Heroism Medal & framed Certificate to Jack Wilson. Mr. Wilson is the head of security at West Freeway Church of Christ and was praised for his “heroic actions” after he shot and killed the gunman who opened fire inside the church on Sunday, December 30, 2019.

Col. Harkins installed the new slate of chapter officers: President Maury Rester, Vice President Charlie Gillespie, Secretary/Treasurer Steve Teel, Registrar Wiley Clarkson, and Chaplain Jerry Turner.
