**Color Guard Commander: James Vann Cunningham**


Vann joined SAR in Nov 2013. He also serves on the Texas SAR Color Guard Committee as one of the ten members that represents the Northern Command.


**2025 Tarrant County Veterans Day Parade  
November 11, 2025**

This years parade returns to downtown Fort Worth and our chapter parade trailer will be participating. The trailer will be in the Panther Island Pavilion parking lot by 9:00 am. Muster time for participants is no later than 10:00 am. The pre-parade ceremony begins at 10:30 am and the parade steps off at 11:00 am. The parade will march up West Belknap Street, around the Tarrant County Courthouse, down Commerce Street to 5th Street, west to Houston Street, north to Belknap, and back to the Panther Island parking lot.

## Grave Markings

Vice President Steve Hole has been busy this past summer attending various Patriot Grave Marking ceremonies working towards his second Patriot Grave Marking Medal. Steve earned his first medal in January 2024. Each medal award requires a total of 15 grave markings. Steve has met the requirements for the second medal and has submitted the required paperwork.

What qualifies? Participating as Master of Ceremonies, playing music, listed on the program, laying a wreath, researching the Patriot, labor involving installing a stone or cleaning up/tearing down for the service, and musket salute. You can also obtain credit for a financial donation to each Patriot's stone.

Steve is the second guardsman from the left in the photo at right taken at a Compatriot Grave Marking service in San Antonio. The Compatriot Grave Marking Medal is the second grave marking medal available to members. It also requires 15 grave markings.

## MOWW Massing of the Colors

The Fort Worth Chapter of the Military Order of the World Wars and the Fort Worth ISD JROTC will present the 45th Annual Massing of the Colors on Sunday, November 9, 2025, at 2:30 pm at Trimble Technical High School Auditorium, 1004 W. Cannon, Fort Worth, 76014.

The Massing of the Colors is a Patriotic Ceremony Rededicating Our Faith in The Flag of our Nation. The non-denominational service honors the Colors of the United States of America, and the men and women of our uniformed services who have served and are continuing to serve our country.

General of the Armies John J. "Blackjack" Pershing is the keynote speaker. Stirring military-type music will again be provided by the Frontier Brigade Band with a brief concert beginning at 2:00 pm.

Each unit participating should include two members carrying the American flag and our organization flag. Additional attendees are also invited to attend the ceremony.

Muster time is no later than 1:30 pm.

## Compatriots Stoddard & Wade on Honor Flight

Compatriots Scott Stoddard and Joe Wade were selected to take an Honor Flight out of Dallas to Washington, D.C., on Friday, October 3, and return on Saturday, October 4, 2025.

### What is Honor Flight and What Do They Do?

Honor Flight is a network of volunteers established for the express purpose of getting as many WWII Veterans as possible to Washington, DC to view the World War II Memorial. Earl Morse, a physician's assistant from Ohio, originally set up honor Flight in 2004.

Honor Flight DFW (HFDFW) was established in September 2008 to bring this wonderful effort to the Dallas/Ft Worth/North Texas area. The first flight departed DFW in 2009 and, to date, Honor Flight DFW has flown over 2,000 WWII, Korean and Vietnam veterans to Washington, DC.

The all expense paid, overnight trip to Washington, DC includes visits to: WWII, Korean, Vietnam, Marine (Iwo Jima), Navy and Air Force Memorials and Arlington Cemetery.

Each veteran is assigned a Guardian to ensure his/her safety. Additionally, a team of volunteer medical professionals travels with each flight.

### Day One

The two-day trip begins with a celebratory send-off, including a presentation of the colors, and volunteers cheering and waving flags. The men and women who comprise the veteran group wear their signature blue Honor Flight DFW jackets, shirts and hats, often with their war medals pinned to them. They board a Southwest Airlines jet and head to D.C. for a two day trip they will talk about for the rest of their lives. Scott and Joe needed to be at Dallas Love Field by 9:00 am to check in and attend a mission briefing for their flight. HFDFW Flight #60 departed at 11:05 am and arrived in Washington Reagan airport at 2:55 pm.

As the 3-hour flight departs for Washington D.C., the veterans often receive special recognition from the flight crew, fellow passengers, and even the Dallas Fire Department with a water salute from their fire engines.

The first stop on the journey is the WWII Memorial, which opened in 2004 when the youngest of the WWII veterans were in their late seventies. The World War II Memorial honors the 16 million who served in the armed forces of the U.S., the more than 400,000 who died, and all who supported the war effort from home.

The tour continues to the Korean, Vietnam, and Lincoln memorials.

### Day Two

The next stop for the veterans is Arlington National Cemetery to witness the Changing of the Guard at the Tomb of the Unknowns. Oftentimes, HFDFW is granted the honor of participating in the Wreath Laying Ceremony, four Honor Flight DFW veterans lay a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknowns. Next is a visit to the gravesite of the America's most decorated WWII soldier, fellow Texan Audie Murphy.

The veterans tour the Marine Corps War Memorial (best known as "Iwo Jima"), the Air Force Memorial and the FDR National Memorial. If there is inclement weather, the veterans tour the National Air and Space Museum, Steven F. Udvar-Hazy Center, where the Enola Gay is on display. On some trips the veterans attend a special performance by the United States Air Force band.

The return flight arrived back at Love Field at 9:30 pm to the welcoming cheers of family, friends, and volunteers.

## Vice President’s “Pot Luck” Presentation

Vice President Steve Hole provided an interesting and informative “Pot Luck” presentation at the October chapter meeting. Did you know that General Washington’s favorite dish was hoecakes or Johnny cakes, as they were often called?

General Washington is known to have had major dental issues and in fact by the time he died only had one of his original teeth still in his mouth. Thus, his affection for regularly eating hoecakes, also known as cornmeal pancakes, usually made with just three ingredients—cornmeal, oil, and salt. They were his go-to at breakfast, when he would sit at the table and cover the cakes in lots of butter and honey, washing it all down with a cup of hot tea.

Vice President Hole showed a YouTube video by Cowboy Kent Rollins on how to make hoecakes. Cowboy Kent’s version is quite different from what Mount Vernon describes as the ingredients. [Making George Washington’s Favorite Dish](#) by Cowboy Kent Rollins has corn meal, yeast, warm water, syrup, egg, and salt as its components.

If you wish to try your own hand at making hoecakes, just Google it and you’ll find all sorts of recipes.

## 2026 Texas SAR Dues

**IF YOU HAVE ALREADY PAID YOUR 2026 DUES, YOU MAY DISREGARD THIS EMAIL AND THANK YOU!**

Compatriots,

For those of you who have a deliverable mailing address, your 2026 Dues Notices should have arrived in your home mailbox. These were sent by Bulk Mail to your address of record as of September 1st. Additionally, specific letters via USPS have been sent to many compatriots that we do not have good email addresses for. These were sent after many email addresses were “bounced back” after the email notifications were sent, either because of an invalid email address or because “SPAM” filters did not allow our message to be received. Many Compatriots responded with valid email addresses and we thank you for updating.

**Note:** 2026 dues calculations include a \$3.00 annual assessment to defray expenses which the state will incur in hosting the 2029 National Congress in San Antonio.

**Texas SAR has voted that Junior Members will not need to pay dues for 2026.** Keep in mind that your dues are considered late on **January 1, 2026**. If they are still unpaid 30 days later - NSSAR will drop you from the rolls and you will start to show a gap in your service and not get your magazine. So...please pay them online or by mail as soon as you can to help your Chapter and avoid a lapse in your SAR Service! As in previous years, you have 3 options for paying your dues.

Online/Paypal (option 1) - We encourage everyone to use this option, and pay your dues by credit card through Paypal. [Click here for the online dues payment page](#) and enter your National SAR # and Name as it appears on your Membership Certificate. Then select your primary chapter and any others you maintain dual membership with and follow the checkout procedures. This is operational on the [TexasSAR.org](#) website NOW. PayPal fees have been removed for 2026 Dues payments.

As mentioned, this online Paypal form also allows for secondary (dual) chapters to be added for those wishing to pay as a dual member.

US Mail (option 2) - You simply take the bottom section of the dues invoice you receive in the mail and send a check for the amount indicated with the pre-addressed envelope, stamp it, and return it to us by US mail. This is to be for your PRIMARY Chapter Dues Statements - it only includes dues for your Primary Chapter, State Dues, and National Dues where applicable.

US Mail (option 3) - Use this option if you want to pay by check, but did NOT get a dues notice in the mail or you want to pay NOW for whatever reason. [Click here for the online dues invoice page on the private site](#), grab your dues notice online, print it out, and mail it back in with a check. This option is available NOW on the [TexasSAR.org](#) website. (Contact your chapter President if you do not know the login credentials for the private web site.)

Donations - As many of you are aware, our society has many beneficial funds that you can donate to for great purposes. Each year, when you renew your membership is a great time to make a donation to one of several great options. All Donation \$ will be allocated as you indicate on the form. Please review the items listed in the donations section of the online dues payment page, and support these worthwhile programs. Thank you for your continued support of our programs!

Please do NOT mail to older addresses - those have been closed - USE THE ADDRESS ON THE RETURN ENVELOPE or the ONLINE DUES NOTICE ONLY. If you or your bank mail it somewhere else, there is no guarantee it gets to us or that you will be credited. Getting these in on time is important for your Chapter and you. The sooner your dues are in, the sooner our books are cleared with NSSAR and the funds available to your Chapter in the Spring - and no more reminder calls !!! We appreciate your patience and support !!!




### Liberty Tree Dedication


