The National Society of the Sons of the American Revolution (SAR or NSSAR) is an American congressionally chartered organization, founded in 1889 and headquartered in Louisville, Kentucky.



The PineyWoods Chapter #51 was chartered on February 3, 1994, and is named for its geographic location in the state. We draw members from Houston (S) to Livingston (N) and from The Woodlands (W) to Liberty (E). PineyWoods meets on the 3rd Saturday of each month except June and July at Los Cuco's Mexican Restaurant, Kingwood Texas.



Member National News SAR Member US President Jimmy Carter passed away

President Jimmy Carter was a member of the Atlanta and Button Gwinnett Chapters of the Georgia SAR.

He joined SAR in March of 1990 member No. 134672. His ancestors were Thomas Ansley, Thomas Cox, and Job Morris.

Jimmy Carter, 39th President of the United States, passed away on Sunday, December 29, 2024, at 100 years old. Following a nine day state funeral, he will be laid to rest on Thursday, January 9th, at the Carter Home and Garden, part of Jimmy Carter National Historical Park.

Son of a nurse and a farmer, James Earl Carter Jr, was born in the small farming town of Plains, Georgia. He grew up in the nearby community of Archery and was educated in public school, later attending Georgia Southwestern College in Americus and the Georgia Institute of Technology in Atlanta. In 1946, he graduated from the United States Naval Academy in Annapolis, Maryland, and became a submariner. Carter received further training in reactor technology and nuclear physics at Union College in Schenectady, New York, and served as pre-commissioning officer

for the US Navy's second nuclear submarine, the USS Seawolf.

He left the navy and returned to Plains to take over his family's peanut farm af-



ter the death of his father in 1953. He became active in the civil-rights movement with the Democratic Party and moved into politics, being the governor of Georgia from 1971 to 1975 and serving one term as the 39th president of the United States from 1977 to 1981. He married Rosalynn Smith in 1946. They had 4 children and shared 77 years together, with Rosalynn being a crucial partner in both his political and philanthropic activities until her death in 2023. Sixteen US President joined NSSAR. The first was Rutherford Birchard Hayes (1877-1881).






