President's Message

THE SHOT HEARD ROUND THE WORLD

April is a vitally important month in American History. The Battles of Lexington and Concord, fought on April 19, 1775, kicked off the American Revolutionary War (1775-83). . Many more battles followed, and in 1783 the colonists formally won our independence.

The "shot heard round the world" is a phrase that refers to the opening shot of the battles of Lexington and Concord. It originates from the opening stanza of Ralph Waldo Emerson's 1837 poem "Concord Hymn". But the source of the phrase is outweighed by the power of the phrase. That shot heard round the world was the first to start a democracy.

The United States was the first nation in modern times to achieve its independence in a national war of liberation and the first to explain its reasons and its aims in a Declaration of Independence.

In addition to establishing our Independence, the American Revolution established a republic, with a government dedicated to the interests of ordinary people rather than the interests of kings and aristocrats.

The American Revolution committed the new nation to ideals of liberty, equality, natural and civil rights, and responsible citizenship and made them the basis of a new political order.

We as SAR members are living legacies of the Revolution and these principles, more important now as we face the challenges of the modern world than ever before. Without understanding them, we find our history incomprehensible, our present confused, and our future dark. Understanding them, we recognize our common origins, appreciate our present challenges, and can advocate successfully for the principles of our democracy.

Before the final concert March 22, the Color Guard presented a framed Good Citizenship Certificate and Medal, jointly sponsored by the Plano and Arlington Chapter Color Guards, to the Orchestra and to its Director/Conductor, Hector Guzman.

The State SAR John Bruce Stuart Jr. Memorial Award: Established by the Plano Chapter in memory of Compatriot John B. Stuart Jr.

This award was established by the Plano Chapter in memory of Compatriot John B. Stuart Jr. and is awarded to the Chapter that best meets the criteria based on Veterans activities in the past year.

John Bruce Stuart was the Historian of the Plano Chapter. He was known as "Mr. Volunteer" in Plano. When former Plano Chapter President John Greer started chairing the State Veterans committee around 1997, the State of Texas had no Veterans award. We used to have plaques for each contest. There was only one winner. The Georgia Society was putting together a National contest and Doug Stanberry and Stan Evans were the driving force and it became the USS Stark award. Bruce passed away and his widow donated \$100 to purchase the plaque and I made a motion at the State to name our state award The John Bruce Stuart Memorial Veterans award and we would use the same criteria as the Stark award. The Chapter with the most points got the plaque and the other three categories would get a certificate. Over the years we made sure it was, and would always be, a State Veterans award sponsored by the Plano Chapter in Honor of John Bruce Stuart.

The "award" is now one winner, and a certificate given at the state meeting signed by the state president and the winner named by the state chairman of the Veterans Committee.

New at the National WWII Museum in New Orleans

Although there are more than 130 World War II museums in the US, there is only one National WWII Museum – in New Orleans. That unique museum is a must-see for a better understanding of World War II, the war to defend democracies from attacks by fascist totalitarian Nazi Germany and Imperial Japan.

I will not reiterate what is available on the museum's excellent website. What I want to share with you is the new interactive exhibit, made possible by artificial intelligence (AI), where visitors can have a discussion with images of 18 WWII veterans, an aircraft factory worker, and even a dancer who performed in USO shows. One can ask questions about the war or about their personal lives. This exhibit opened on March 20th. The 18 veterans and war-effort supporters sat for interviews over a period of four years and each answered up to thousand questions.

The visitor can stand in front of a console and pick who they want to converse with. Then a life-size image of that person, comfortably seated, appears on the screen. Using AI algorithms, the console selects the best of the up to one thousand answers to match to the visitor's questions.

Veterans used to volunteer to man a table at the museum to answer visitors' questions about WWII, but since the museum opened in 2000 the number of WWII veterans still alive has made that practice almost impossible.

In conclusion, if you plan to visit New Orleans, use the museums <u>website</u> to buy your tickets for a given day and time. That site also has information on hotel reservations and dining as well as other information to make your visit as pleasant and productive as possible.

Patriot Stories

Beginning with this issue of the Newsletter, we will explore the accounts of the Patriot Ancestors of our Membership. Weather involved in close action or providing beef and grain to the troops, our ancestors all had a hand in creating this great nation. Please take the time to enjoy the sacrifices and actions of these as we share their stories each month.

Compatriot Bradford Gaian, whose Patriot Ancestor is **Nathan Noble**, a Massachusetts Private born in 1722 who died at Saratoga 7 Oct 1777. The American victory at Saratoga was a clear turning point in the Revolution, with the French joining our cause with the demonstration of American strength and will. There is actually a short book entitled "A Soldier of Three Wars" written about him. He was a veteran soldier before the Revolution, having previously fought in Louisburg, and the French and Indian War. The book says that "after the battle was won... he was struck by a musket-ball in the forehead and mortally wounded".

BJ Bjorkland, whose Patriot ancestor is **John Edwards**, a soldier who enlisted at Concord in 1777, and was to become a Colonel. BJ retold the story passed down from the Patriot's wife born Susannah Harrington. She was an 11 year old girl in Lexington Ma on April 19, 1775 when she heard the alarm that "The Redcoats Are Coming!" Before the day was over three of her Harrington cousins would be slain by the Redcoats. As an old lady, Susannah passed the first hand story of Lexington to her granddaughter, who repeated the story to her DAR Chapter.




The First Formal Recognition of the American Flag by a Foreign Warship

February 14, 1778

On this date, the United States flag was formally recognized for the first time by a foreign naval vessel. The 74-gun French ship of the line *Robuste*, commanded by **Count Toussaint-Guillaume Picquet de la Motte**, rendered a nine-gun salute to the *USS Ranger*, commanded by **Captain John Paul** Jones.


The Featured Speaker Presentation
