

TO ALL PLANO SAR CHAPTER MEMBERS WHO SERVED DURING THE VIETNAM WAR ERA:

The Department of Defense (DoD) has authorized any veterans who served anywhere and in any capacity during the Vietnam Era, Nov 1, 1955 to May 15, 1975 to be eligible to receive a **Vietnam Veteran Lapel Pin (VVLP)**.

Pins have previously been awarded at scheduled group events, but the DoD has now made it possible for eligible veterans to request a pin be delivered to their home address. This program is open to all Veterans, not just our chapter members, so if you know of eligible veterans not in our chapter, feel free to notify them of the program. If eligible Veterans have not previously received a pin, here is how one can be ordered:

1. Veterans who served anywhere in any capacity during the period Nov 1, 1955 to May 15, 1975 are eligible to receive a pin.

2. Veterans can email <u>whs.pentagon.wso.mbx.vnwar50th-cpp-events-application@mail.mil</u> and a Vietnam Veteran Lapel Pin will be sent to you via USPS. Please include a good mailing address including your city and state.

Contributed by Bob Johns Regarding his Patriot Ancestor Thomas Johns



My ancestor is named Thomas Johns, my 4th great grandfather. Thomas was born in about 1758 in Charlotte County, Virginia pretty much in the center of Virginia. Nothing is known of his early years. At the age of 24 in 1781 he joined the Pittsylvania County, 6th Virginia Regiment Continental Army. He served in the American Revolutionary War from 1781-1783 when it ended. His father, William Johns of Cumberland County, born around 1710, was a supplier to the American Revolutionary troops and filed paperwork for reimbursement in 1783. Thomas' service activities are not known to me, but Virginia played a pivotal role in the struggle for American independence. Virginia troops were documented as being engaged from the Atlantic Ocean to the Mississippi River and many of their citizens provided some form of military or public service.

Thomas is recorded with the rank of Ensign which was the junior rank of a commissioned officer in the militia and other armed forces, and I read that the title was replaced in the U S army by the rank of second lieutenant in 1815. As the junior officer in an infantry regiment it was commonly the duty of officers of this rank and at this time to carry the colors of the regiment. Thomas served in the Continental Army of the south under the command of General Nathanael Greene, after whom Greensboro, N C is named.

Thomas' regiment is recorded to have participated in the Guilford Courthouse battles. On March 15, 1781, British General Charles Lord Cornwallis's army of 2,100 men engaged a Continental army under Major General Nathanael Greene at Guilford Courthouse, near present-day Greensboro, North Carolina. It was a pivotal battle after which Cornwallis moved his troops to Yorktown to recoup and perhaps escape but of course that never happened, as Cornwallis was trapped by Continental troops enforced by French regulars, blockaded by the Spanish navy and forced to surrender. I have no proof he did so, but I often picture my Ensign ancestor carrying the Guilford Courthouse flag (pictured above) when I carry it myself at SAR color guard events.

Thomas served until the end of the revolutionary war in 1783 and was married to a woman with the interesting name of Gaterhood Glover.

Thomas died in Pittsylvania Virginia in 1794. His assets at death were valued at £800 and included 16 slaves as was not uncommon at that time. Among his assets were four feather beds, 2 men's saddles and 2 women's saddles, 3 horses, assorted animals and a bevy of household goods including 4 featherbeds, 6 new plates, 7 spoons and 4 cups with saucers.
