As you know, the annual worldwide event, Wreaths Across America event will occur again this December 2024. Our chapter helped fund and support the event at the Pecan Grove Cemetery in McKinney. We will do so again this year.

Thank you everyone in our chapter who purchased wreaths for your incredible support of Wreaths Across America in 2023! With your help, the event honored 3 million veterans nationwide with wreaths placed at 4224 participating locations last year.

Our Texas state report on wreaths purchased and placed in 2023 recorded wreaths purchased were placed on 260,256 veteran's graves, the most of any state.

Wreaths Across America will be publicized more this coming fall. Please plan to participate. Let's unite our communities in the SAR mission to REMEMBER, HONOR, and TEACH!

TO ALL PLANO SAR CHAPTER MEMBERS WHO SERVED DURING THE VIETNAM WAR ERA:

The Department of Defense (DoD) has authorized any veterans who served anywhere and in any capacity during the Vietnam Era, Nov 1, 1955 to May 15, 1975 to be eligible to receive a **Vietnam Veteran Lapel Pin (VVLP)**.

Pins have previously been awarded at scheduled group events, but the DoD has now made it possible for eligible veterans to request a pin be delivered to their home address. This program is open to all Veterans, not just our chapter members, so if you know of eligible veterans not in our chapter, feel free to notify them of the program. If eligible Veterans have not previously received a pin, here is how one can be ordered:

- 1. Veterans who served anywhere in any capacity during the period Nov 1, 1955 to May 15, 1975 are eligible to receive a pin.
- 2. Veterans can email whs.pentagon.wso.mbx.vnwar50th-cpp-events-application@mail.mil and a Vietnam Veteran Lapel Pin will be sent to you via USPS. Please include a good mailing address including your city and state.

Patriot Stories

Contributed by Dave Fautheree Regarding his Patriot Ancestor Antoine Bordelon

Antoine Bordelon was in New Orleans, Louisiana in 1733. His parents were Gabriel Laurens Bordelon, born 25 October 1696 in Le Havre, Normandy, France and Anne Françoise Rolland, born abt 1699 in Paris, France. Gabriel was an officer of the Company of the Indies which had the Royal Charter to settle Louisiana.

Antoine was married twice. His first marriage to Marie Anne Décuir was recorded on 23 April 1759 at St. François d'Assise Catholic Church at Le Poste de la Pointe Coupée in (what is now) the New Roads area of Pointe Coupée Parish, Louisiana. Seven children were born from this union. After his wife's death in 1778, Antoine married Marie Marguerite Frédéric dite Leonard on 20 July 1779. His second union produced five more children.

At the end of the French and Indian War in 1763, the Louisiana colony was transferred from France to Spain. Antoine was an officer in the Pointe Coupée Militia, serving as the militia company's primary aide (Aide-Major) and also as Assistant Regimental Adjutant in the Louisiana Infantry Regiment. He held the rank of Sous-Lieutenant (2nd Lt). He served under Governor Bernardo de Galvez against the British in the Galvez Expedition after Spain declared war on Great Britain in June 1779.

He participated in the Battles of Manchac, Baton Rouge, and Natchez where Galvez defeated the British and captured the British forts in those locations. This defeat of the British cleared the lower Mississippi River of British forces and put the mighty river totally under allied control.

In 1785, he was documented in a census as a resident of Le Poste de la Avoyelles (currently Avoyelles Parish, Louisiana). He had been granted 1000-arpents of land there by the Spanish government - likely for his military service.

He died on 24 November 1785. His burial took place a day later and was recorded in the records of St. François d'Assise Catholic Church (Pointe Coupée Parish). His grave was likely located in the cemetery of the 1760 church. Unfortunately, almost all of the graves from this church were lost to the Mississippi River when it changed course in the early 19th Century.

This Month's Fun Factoid



Constitution Day 17 September

Constitution Day is celebrated on September 17, the anniversary of the signing of our Constitution in 1787. It is a National Day of Observance, but not widely celebrated. The law establishing the present holiday was created in 2004. Unknown by most, in 1917 the National Sons of the American Revolution (yes—our organization) formed a committee to promote Constitution Day. The committee included members such as Calvin Coolidge, John D Rockefeller and General John Pershing.



An interesting sidelight to the history around Constitution Day is that in recommending the concept of a holiday, U S Senator Warren G Harding first used the term "Founding Fathers" at the Republican National Convention in 1916. That phrase has been used since by nearly everyone who writes about our national origin.

The Constitution and its co-founding document The Declaration of Independence are stored in our National Archives and continue to be honored and celebrated for nearly 2 ½ centuries.

The History Minute "The First Virginia Convention"






Randy takes a look at the beginnings of organized resistance to the British Government on a colonial level. We examine the first such movement by the Virginia House of Burgesses after they were dissolved by the Governor, Lord Dunmore, for showing public support for the colonists in Boston after the British government enacted the Boston Port Act. The Burgesses convened at Raleigh Tavern and declared themselves the rightful government of the colony. They called for the other colonies to do likewise and to send delegates to a Continental Congress.

The Featured Speaker Presentation "Ravens and Sparrows: Washington's Spies"

Introduced by Melvin Richards, VP of Programs
Presented by Patricia Thibodeau

Patricia discussed the secret intelligence network created by George Washington to assist in gaining information that would help the Patriots win the war. She described the underground spy network consisting of men (Ravens) and women (Sparrows) who utilized secret alias covert signals for communication (like a white handkerchief hanging from a clothes line) and common letters containing messages written with invisible ink. Pat revealed the exploits of intrepid spies such as Nathan Hale who, after successfully passing a good body of intelligence to General Washington, was caught by the British and hanged. She explained the work of the Culper Ring, a covert spy ring commissioned by General Washington and centered in New York City. Pat concluded with a description of how these various spy operations gained valuable intelligence enabling the Patriots to win the Revolutionary War.
