TO ALL PLANO SAR CHAPTER MEMBERS! You Make a Difference!

Compatriots,

As we prepare our annual report to State and National on our chapters support of veterans, please help us report everything, including individual members support that your chapters board may not know about.

ALL Compatriots that are members of the Texas SAR can participate in this effort, so I am asking you to review your calendars and records of non-profit giving for this year and other activities noted below and send responses to chapter president <u>Bob Johns</u>. Your Chapter responses REALLY make a difference and strongly keep our State amongst the best in the SAR.

Authorized activities include:

(1) Memorial Services/Funerals of any Veteran. Please send name of deceased veteran, date, location, your role if any, and distance(r/t) travelled.

(2) Personal donations (check/cash) to a Veterans Service organization, such as Wounded Warriors, VFW, USO, Paralyzed Vets, Purple Heart, American Legion, Camp Hope, Tunnel for Towers, etc. I will NEED amount, date of gift, and organization that received your gift. The key to their qualification is: Is the organization's primary client the Veteran? If yes, it qualifies. For every mile driven/flown to a funeral, one point is credited. For every dollar donated, one point is credited.

(3) Donations of clothing (new or used) to a Veterans Service organization, such as VFW, American Legion, Texas Paralyzed, Disabled Texas Veterans or Disabled American Veterans. Others are acceptable as well, BUT they must have Veterans as the Primary client. Please indicate date donated, organization name, and amount paid for new clothing (men or women). If donating used clothing, then credit is based on 1/3 of original price. For each dollar value of clothing donated, one point is credited.

(4) Wreaths Across America - Purchase of 3 wreaths for Wreaths Across America will make a Chapter qualified at 50 points minimum for their Stark report.

(5) Personal cost incurred for Wreaths, Flowers, or Flags placed on the Graves of any Veteran.

TO ALL PLANO SAR CHAPTER MEMBERS

WHO SERVED DURING THE VIETNAM WAR ERA:

The Department of Defense (DoD) has authorized any veterans who served anywhere and in any capacity during the Vietnam Era, Nov 1, 1955 to May 15, 1975 to be eligible to receive a **Vietnam Veteran Lapel Pin (VVLP)**.

Pins have previously been awarded at scheduled group events, but the DoD has now made it possible for eligible veterans to request a pin be delivered to their home address. This program is open to all Veterans, not just our chapter members, so if you know of eligible veterans not in our chapter, feel free to notify them of the program. If eligible Veterans have not previously received a pin, here is how one can be ordered:

1. Veterans who served anywhere in any capacity during the period Nov 1, 1955 to May 15, 1975 are eligible to receive a pin.

2. Veterans can email <u>whs.pentagon.wso.mbx.vnwar50th-cpp-events-application@mail.mil</u> and a Vietnam Veteran Lapel Pin will be sent to you via USPS. Please include a good mailing address including your city and state.

Contributed by Mike Flagg Regarding his Patriot Ancestor Richard Callaway

Richard Callaway (June 14, 1717 – November 8, 1780) was an American frontiersman, military officer, politician, and hunter who was one of the first white settlers in modern-day Kentucky. Born in Essex County, Virginia, Callaway joined Daniel Boone in 1775 in marking the Wilderness Road into central Kentucky, becoming one of the founders of Boonesborough, Kentucky. He took part in organizing the short-lived Transylvania Colony. In 1776, two of Callaway's daughters, along with Daniel Boone's Jemima, were abducted outside Boonesborough by Cherokee and Shawnee raiding party. Callaway led one of a group of settlers in the successful rescue of the girls. His nephew Flanders Callaway later married Jemima Boone. In April 1777, Callaway and John Todd were elected to the Virginia legislature as burgesses from Kentucky County, Virginia.

In June 1778, he was appointed a justice of the peace and made colonel of the county's militia. Callaway was a defender during the Siege of Boonesborough. He disagreed with some of Boone's actions and resented the younger man's popularity with the settlers, and later brought court martial charges against Boone. Callaway was angry when the court acquitted and then promoted him. On November 8, 1780, Colonel Richard Callaway was ambushed about a mile outside of Boonesborough by a Shawnee war party. He was killed and scalped, and his body was mutilated. Calloway County, Kentucky, was named after Callaway.

SAR Presidents of the United States!

An important factor that has attracted men of all social and economic levels to join the Sons of the American Revolution is that the Society is thoroughly American; democratic; nonpartisan and nonsectarian.

The qualifications are simply to be of good character and be a lineal descendant of a Patriot who served the cause of American independence during the Revolutionary War. In the one hundred and twenty-six years our Society has been in existence, the Sons of the American Revolution membership rolls list 149,000 Compatriots.

Station in life is not a factor for SAR membership. However, the SAR is justly proud of our Compatriots that have become, or are, Presidents of the United States of America. The importance of the Presidency of the United States has dramatically increased since George Washington, our first President. We would like to think that the patriotic ideals and declared goals of the Society had some influence on the decisions these Presidents made. Since our founding, in 1875, seventeen Presidents of the United States have been or are members of the SAR. Unfortunately, as a Society we have no provisions for honorary membership, hence Presidents John F. Kennedy and Ronald W. Reagan who did not have the necessary Revolutionary War ancestry to attain SAR membership were not eligible. Presidents James Garfield, Chester Arthur, Grover Cleveland, Woodrow Wilson, Richard M. Nixon and William J. Clinton had the required ancestry, but for reasons unknown to us did not join. President Ulysses S. Grant, was not a member of the Sons of the American Revolution, but was a member of our parent organization, the Sons of Revolutionary War Sires. He passed away before the SAR was founded, but his membership in the Sons of Revolutionary War Sires would have automatically transferred his membership into the SAR, hence his inclusion in the roster of Presidents of the United States who were or are members of the Society.

The Featured Speaker Presentation "Christmas in the Revolution"

Introduced by Melvin Richards, VP of Programs Presented by Tracy Pounders, Texas SAR President

President Pounders discusses the connection between the United States Code and the Sons of the American Revolution. When Congress created Title 36 of the Code to list non-profit organizations that took on specific responsibilities, Chapter 1 lists the four organizations it had in mind: The DAR, the SAR, the American Red Cross and the American Historical Association.

President Pounders sets the stage for events of Christmas 1776 by explaining the the Puritans and Quakers of the Northeast did not celebrate Christmas. Gifts were not given in the same way as today and Santa Claus had not yet appeared in the colonies. The was a great deal of deprivation that year. Both the British and the Patriots were blockading ports and cutting off supplies. Despite the military losses suffered by George Washington, he received four special Christmas gifts: Thomas Paine's "The American Crisis" was published. The second was that 3,600 reinforcements arrived, making a total of 6,000 troops under his command. The third was the reception of much-needed supplies, including wool blankets. The fourth was the successful capture of Trenton, NJ after crossing the Delaware River. We have much to be thankful for these presents to George Washington.
