## **National Vietnam War Veterans Day**

## Compatriots,

I want to call all Members' attention to our **National Vietnam War Veterans Day** which occurs on **29 March** every year and to the **United States of America Vietnam War Commemoration**, which continues through **Veterans Day**, **11 November 2025**.

The Vietnam War Veterans Recognition Act of 2017 designates March 29 as National Vietnam War Veterans Day....."a day set aside in perpetuity for our nation to thank and honor all Vietnam Veterans". This special day joins six other military-centric annual observances codified in Title 4 of the United States Code §6, among them Memorial Day, Independence Day and Veterans Day. 29 March is a fitting choice for a day honoring Vietnam veterans. It was chosen to be observed in perpetuity as March 29, 1973 was the day United States Military Assistance Command, Vietnam was disestablished and also the day the last U.S. combat troops departed Vietnam. In addition, on and around this same day Hanoi released the last of its acknowledged prisoners of war.

The United States of America Vietnam War Commemoration honors all veterans who served on active duty in the U.S. Armed Forces at any time from November 1, 1955 to May 15, 1975, regardless of location, and their families. This national commemoration was authorized by Congress, established under the Secretary of Defense, and launched by the President to thank and honor our Nation's Vietnam veterans and their families for their service and sacrifice.

# SAR Military Service Medals and Pins





There are two SAR Medals and one Department of Defense Lapel Pin available to SAR Member/Veterans who qualify. The chapter has publicized and awarded these to members in the past, but new members may not be aware and some current members may not have inquired.

### Here are the two SAR Medals:

## **The Military Service Medal**



## This medal is earned by any member who has served in the military.

The Military Service Medal may be presented to a Compatriot in recognition of military service which does not otherwise qualify for the War Service Medal.

Proof of Service: Proof of service, in the form of a copy of the member's discharge (or other U.S. or Allied Government proof in the case of a member in active service), must

be provided to the Chapter VP for Veterans Affairs, B J Bjorklund.

# SAR Military Service Medals and Pins (Cont'd)



### The War Service Medal



## This medal is earned by any member who served or is serving in a war.

Proof of Service: Proof of service, in the form of a copy of the member's discharge (or other U.S. or Allied Government proof in the case of a member in active service), must be presented to the <a href="Chapter VP for Veterans Affairs">Chapter VP for Veterans Affairs</a>, B J Bjorklund before the medal can be worn.

Such proof must show that the Compatriot:

- 1) Served, or is serving, honorably in:
  - a) The armed forces of the United States
  - b) The military forces of a country allied with the United States
  - c) A United Nations Peacekeeping Force
- 2) Served against a common enemy in a war or action recognized by a branch of the Armed Forces of the United States
- 3) Received a campaign medal, combat ribbon or badge as shown on the DD-214 form (or equivalent).

## **Department of Defense Vietnam War Lapel Pin**



The DoD Vietnam War Lapel Pin is available to any veteran who served in the combat zone, in any military branch, in any capacity during the Vietnam War as defined by DoD as between Nov 1, 1955 and May 15, 1975. # The SAR JROTC Cadet Recognition Program



Compatriots,

The importance of our **SAR JROTC Cadet Recognition Program** cannot be overemphasized. Here is an overview of what this program is about:

The National Society of the Sons of the American Revolution (SAR) awards the ROTC Medal to foster the principle of the "citizen-soldier," exemplified by the Minutemen of Revolutionary War days. This award is presented by an SAR Chapter, State-level Society, or the National Society to ROTC or JROTC cadets who are selected for having a high degree of merit with respect to leadership qualities, military bearing, and general excellence. The recipients are selected by the Commanding Officer of the ROTC or JROTC unit, who should be given full latitude in making the selection.

SAR members are direct descendants of those patriots that achieved the independence of the American people and the objectives of the organization are intended to perpetuate a more profound reverence for the principles of the government founded by our forefathers. Such were the ideals of Captain Alden Partridge, who is considered the founder of the Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC) program in the United States. Partridge founded the ROTC because his father, Samuel Partridge, a soldier of the Revolution, had concern for the newly founded United States and its lacking a development resource for qualified military officers. SAR supports all programs that encourage historical research, foster true patriotism, and maintain and extend the institutions of American freedom. It strongly supports the United States ROTC and JROTC as exemplary programs of these ideals.

What should be of importance to us, Compatriots, is the support that we can render to these programs by our attendance at the JROTC End of Year Awards Ceremonies. While our Color Guard participates in the programs, we compatriots can attend as observers who support the recipients in their JROTC journey. In this Newsletter, you will find a list of upcoming JROTC events that you can support by your attendance.



## The 2025 Activities Celebrating President James Monroe's 267th Birthday

You are cordially invited to attend and participate in both ceremonies for President Monroe – one in Richmond (at Hollywood Cemetery) and the other in Westmoreland County (at the Monroe Birthplace farm south of Colonial Beach). As always, these events are free and open to the public, so we hope that you will encourage your family and friends to join you.

Hollywood Cemetery Ceremony 412 S Cherry St Richmond VA 23220 28 April 2025, 11:00am

This year our annual wreath-laying ceremony at *President Monroe's tomb* in *Hollywood Cemetery* in Richmond will be at *11:00 a.m. Monday morning*. April 28 is President Monroe's actual birthday, and the Hollywood Cemetery ceremony is traditionally held on that date. Since the 1930s, the Hollywood Cemetery ceremony has included a formal military ceremony with an Army unit presenting a wreath on behalf of the President. That tradition was discontinued by the Army last year. and we do not yet know when or if it will resume. Last year's ceremony, with a Foundation supplied color guard and band, was still outstanding, and the wreath presentations by a large number of lineage societies were as impressive as ever.

After the ceremony, a *lunch reception* will be held at the *Taylor House, 2325 Monument Avenue* in Richmond. The Taylor House is regarded as one of the finest homes in Richmond, and the reception there last year was a great success.

5 October 2025 2:00pm

Starting at **2:00 p.m. at the Birthplace**, the 267th anniversary ceremonies are expected to include local and state elected officials. Come to see both the **Birthplace House** and the exhibits at the **Visitor Center**. The ceremony will be in front of the Birthplace House again, rather than in front of the Visitor Center. See <a href="https://www.monroefoundation.org">www.monroefoundation.org</a> for the Birthplace location at 4460 James Monroe Highway (State Rt. 205) just outside of Colonial Beach.

Please remember that President Monroe was the only President besides George Washington to have actively served in the regular army during the Revolutionary War, participating in six major battles (as well as wintering at Valley Forge, crossing the Delaware with George Washington, being seriously wounded at Trenton and cited for conspicuous bravery) and subsequently served simultaneously as Secretary of War and Secretary of State (during the War of 1812, when he helped coordinate American defenses against the British). He was also an active participant in our first American lineage society, the Society of the Cincinnati.

When James Monroe and other patriots seized the Virginia Governor's Palace on June 24, 1775, and distributed its armory of muskets, pistols, and swords to the Williamsburg militia, that act began the Revolutionary War in Virginia. Let's celebrate that 250th anniversary by honoring James Monroe in proper fashion!

We hope that you will be able to participate with us in these commemorations to emphasize the role of this great Virginian and Founding Father in establishing our country, and its system of government and values.



## Contributed by Bryan Humphreys Regarding his Patriot Ancestor John Black

My 5th great grandfather John Black was born in Scotland about 1723. He and his wife Abigail and son James came to the colonies about 1745 and settled in Tyrone township, Cumberland County, Pennsylvania. John Black acquired a significant amount of land over the years. Tyrone township became Rye township in 1766 which still exists today in the current Perry County, Pennsylvania, which is near Harrisburg & Hershey. John and Abigail raised 6 sons and 4 daughters. I descend from their second son John who was born in 1746.

The Pennsylvania Militia act of 1777 required all men between the ages of 18 and 53 capable of bearing arms to serve 2 months of militia duty on a rotating basis. So, at the age of approximately 52 years old, John Black, along with 4 of his sons, enlisted in the 1st Company, 7th Battalion of the Cumberland County Militia under Col Frederick Watts & Capt James Fisher. A 5th son, William, had moved to Georgia where he served in the Georgia Militia.

John Black likely did not serve longer than one year in the militia due to his age. I have not found any records describing revolutionary war activities of his Company and Battalion.

His son John, from which I descend, married Mary Robinson whose father George Robinson is my original patriot.

## The New England Pine Tree Riots

Leading up to the American Revolution, Great Britain relied heavily on its Royal Navy, and in order to build and maintain this huge fleet of ships, they needed trees. Under the Mast Preservation Clause in the Massachusetts Charter in 1691, Britain laid claim to any white pine measuring 24 inches in diameter



or greater, and in 1722 a law passed in New Hampshire made it illegal to cut down white pines measuring 12 inches or more.

The "mast pines", as they were named for their suitability as single-stick masts and booms, were identified by a Surveyor of the King's Woods, and marked with a broad arrow for exporting to England. The colonists resented the restrictions on the timber they used for their needs and livelihoods, and many continued to harvest the marked trees.

The law caused more anger and backlash than the Stamp Act or even the Tea Tax, and eventually resulted in the Pine Tree Riot of 1772. After being fined and refusing to pay for harvesting trees marked with the broad arrow, a New Hampshire mill owner, along with other mill owners and townsmen, assaulted the Sheriff and his Deputy by lashing them with tree switches, cutting off their horses' ears, manes and tails, and forcing them out of town through a jeering crowd.

Occurring almost two years prior to the more well-known Boston Tea Party, the Pine Tree Riot was one of the first acts of forceful resistance against British royal authority by the American colonists, and among the disputes that culminated in the American Revolution.
