

The SAR JROTC Cadet Recognition Program



Compatriots,

The importance of our **SAR JROTC Cadet Recognition Program** cannot be overemphasized. Here is an overview of what this program is about:

The National Society of the Sons of the American Revolution (SAR) awards the ROTC Medal to foster the principle of the "citizen-soldier," exemplified by the Minutemen of Revolutionary War days. This award is presented by an SAR Chapter, State-level Society, or the National Society to ROTC or JROTC cadets who are selected for having a high degree of merit with respect to leadership qualities, military bearing, and general excellence. The recipients are selected by the Commanding Officer of the ROTC or JROTC unit, who should be given full latitude in making the selection.

SAR members are direct descendants of those patriots that achieved the independence of the American people and the objectives of the organization are intended to perpetuate a more profound reverence for the principles of the government founded by our forefathers. Such were the ideals of Captain Alden Partridge, who is considered the founder of the Reserve Officer Training Corps (ROTC) program in the United States. Partridge founded the ROTC because his father, Samuel Partridge, a soldier of the Revolution, had concern for the newly founded United States and its lacking a development resource for qualified military officers. SAR supports all programs that encourage historical research, foster true patriotism, and maintain and extend the institutions of American freedom. It strongly supports the United States ROTC and JROTC as exemplary programs of these ideals.

What should be of importance to us, Compatriots, is the support that we can render to these programs by our attendance at the JROTC End of Year Awards Ceremonies. While our Color Guard participates in the programs, we compatriots can attend as observers who support the recipients in their JROTC journey. In this Newsletter, you will find a list of upcoming JROTC events that you can support by your attendance.

Compatriots, the Texas SAR State Convention produced a great deal of information detailing the accomplishments and actions of the Texas Chapters this past year. This report, compiled from the Final Report filed by Past President Tracy Pounders, gives the high points of this past year's activities:

Membership

As of March 8, 2025 we have 2,731 members. We have 45 new members and 230 Junior members, so we have a firm foundation for continued growth going forward. Although we currently have 544 drops we also had 334 reinstatements this year, so its likely many of these drops will likewise be reinstated. We should work hard to continue this trend and retain as many members each year as we can.

Community Engagement

The Texas SAR has been very active in the Community this year, both at the state level and the local level. There is no way to list them all in this report. But our relationship with Wreaths Across America is very special and should continue to be nurtured. And a special shout out to our color guards, both the state and our locals, is well deserved. There may be no better thing that we do to get the community's attention than what we do with our color guards – it connects both children and adults to our Revolutionary War heritage and provides them the perfect opportunity to ask about the SAR and what we do. Our color guards keep our organization in the public eye – and we can't get enough of that!

The 2025 Activities Celebrating President James Monroe's 267th Birthday

Westmoreland County Ceremony
The Birthplace and Visitor's Center
4460 James Monroe Highway Colonial Beach VA 22443
5 October 2025 2:00pm

Starting at **2:00 p.m. at the Birthplace**, the 267th anniversary ceremonies are expected to include local and state elected officials. Come to see both the **Birthplace House** and the exhibits at the **Visitor Center**. The ceremony will be in front of the Birthplace House again, rather than in front of the Visitor Center. See www.monroefoundation.org for the Birthplace location at 4460 James Monroe Highway (State Rt. 205) just outside of Colonial Beach.

Please remember that President Monroe was the only President besides George Washington to have actively served in the regular army during the Revolutionary War, participating in six major battles (as well as wintering at Valley Forge, crossing the Delaware with George Washington, being seriously wounded at Trenton and cited for conspicuous bravery) and subsequently served simultaneously as Secretary of War and Secretary of State (during the War of 1812, when he helped coordinate American defenses against the British). He was also an active participant in our first American lineage society, the Society of the Cincinnati.

When James Monroe and other patriots seized the Virginia Governor's Palace on June 24, 1775, and distributed its armory of muskets, pistols, and swords to the Williamsburg militia, that act began the Revolutionary War in Virginia. Let's celebrate that 250th anniversary by honoring James Monroe in proper fashion!

We hope that you will be able to participate with us in this commemorations to emphasize the role of this great Virginian and Founding Father in establishing our country, and its system of government and values.


Contributed by Randall Bush Regarding his Patriot Ancestor William D Reeve

William D Reeve, the son of George Reeve (1730 - 1778), was born on 5 April, 1756 in Prince William County Virginia. In the summer of 1776, William enlisted in Prince William County and served for three weeks as a Private in James Ewell's Company under Colonel Henry Lee's Virginia Regiment. In the fall of 1776, he again enlisted for three weeks and served as a Private in the same company and regiment. On 1 January, 1777, he enlisted in Fauquier County, Virginia and served for four months as a Private in Captain James Scott's Virginia Company under Colonels Hollingsworth and Stricker.

Private Reeve saw action in the Battle of Quibbletown, NJ on 8 February 1777. He then served for three weeks as a Lieutenant in Captain Evan's Virginia Company. In 1781, he served for three weeks as a Lieutenant in Captain Valentine Payton's Virginia Company.

Upon his discharge, Lieutenant Reeve was given land in Abbeville District, SC where he went to live. In 1840, he removed to DeKalb County, GA to live with his son, James White Reeve.

Lieutenant William Reeve passed on 14 March 1842 in DeKalb County, GA. He rests along with his wife, Arnetta, in the Nancy Creek Primitive Baptist Cemetery.

Compatriot Larry Melton



This Month's Fun Factoid



The Coinage Act of 1792

The Coinage Act of 1792 established a national mint located in Philadelphia. Congress chose decimal coinage in parts of 100, and set the U.S. dollar to the already familiar Spanish milled dollar and its fractional parts (half, quarter, eighth, sixteenth). This resulted in coins of the following metals and denominations:

Copper: half cent and cent
Silver: half dime, dime, quarter,
half dollar, and dollar
Gold: quarter eagle (\$2.50),
half eagle (\$5), and eagle (\$10)



In 1792, during construction of the new Mint, 1,500 silver half dimes were made in the cellar of a nearby building. These half dimes were probably given out to dignitaries and friends and not released into circulation. The Mint delivered the nation's first circulating coins on March 1, 1793: 11,178 copper cents.

These new cents caused a bit of a public outcry. They were larger than a modern quarter, a bulky size for small change. The image of Liberty on the obverse showed her hair steaming behind her and her expression "in a fright." The reverse featured a chain of 15 links, similar to the Fugio cent. However, some people felt that it symbolized slavery instead of unity of the states. The Mint quickly replaced the chain with a wreath, and a couple months later designed a new version of Liberty.
