Indeed, our Founding Fathers and the generations succeeding them did such a good job of preserving our freedom that it's easy to assume following those principles will always happen. That is only true, however, if we continue to support the ideas behind those principles by promoting them and by associating them with responsible action.

How do we, as Compatriots of the Sons of the American Revolution continue to communicate and support the principles stated in that Declaration? The answer lies in our Mission Statement: ***"The Sons of the American Revolution honors our Revolutionary War patriot ancestors by promoting patriotism, serving our communities, and educating and inspiring future generations about the founding principles of our Country."*** While every aspect of this Statement is important, *today, in this time*, the last portion, ***"educating and inspiring future generations about the founding principles of our Country"***, is the most critical. Our work among young people cannot be overemphasized. We educate and inspire students in schools by presenting patriotic and historical programs, along with contests for both students and teachers. We work with JROTC cadets to recognize their hard work and achievements. We work in the community via First Responder recognitions, Flag Certificates, Wreaths Across America in our cemeteries and much more. We work with, and are ramping up our involvement with, the Boy Scouts and Civil Air Patrol. Our youth see, hear and experience the results of our efforts and learn why the founding principles in the Declaration of Independence are important to exercise and protect. As our late President Ronald Reagan once said ***"Freedom is never more than one generation away from extinction. We didn't pass it to our children in the bloodstream. It must be fought for, protected, and handed on for them to do the same, or one day we will spend our sunset years telling our children and our children's children what it was once like in the United States where men were free."*** During this 4th of July season, let us all look beyond the fireworks and cookouts and take steps to preserve "True Freedom" with Education and Inspiration. An Important Message From Our State Chancellor

Compatriots:

We are deep into the 250th Anniversary Year and a midterm Election Year. As a reminder, the Sons of the American Revolution is a nonprofit, nonpartisan organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the U.S. tax code. As such, our organization is prohibited from endorsing or opposing political candidates for public office.

Among the most common situations where an issue might occur are invitations for a SAR Color Guard to post colors or otherwise make an appearance at a political function, meeting or rally of a party or candidate. As this, along with wearing SAR medals, name tags or other SAR identification, would give the appearance of SAR partisanship toward that party or candidate, it must be avoided to preserve the SAR's tax-exempt nonprofit status (see also Texas SAR Bylaws Art. XVII(A), Sec. 5).

An individual SAR member, however, has the freedom to use his colonial attire, uniform, or equipment as he sees fit, if he is not identified, thanked, or recognized from the podium or in a program, as a member of the SAR at such partisan events.

President Whittenburg and I ask that you keep this message in mind as you plan your events this year.

MEMBER APPROVED FLAG PRESENTATIONS

The Summer Issue of SAR Magazine contains NSSAR Goals to be fully implemented by the National Organization, State Societies and Local Chapters. Among those is increasing the issuance of SAR Flag Recognition Certificates.

To refresh your knowledge of Flag Certificates, ***“The SAR Flag Certificate is presented to individuals, companies, and government agencies that fly the United States flag regularly and properly for patriotic purposes.”***

Previously, the Chapter President was required to sign a Flag Certificate prior to issuance. To make Flag Certificates easier to award and to involve the Chapter Membership in general, ***the President General has now delegated authority to award Flag Certificates DIRECTLY to every Chapter Member!***

That means any of us who observes neighbors, businesses, etc who fly the flag regularly can award that person or business a Flag Certificate. Simply send [VP Roger Hardin](#) the entity's name to place on the Certificate, sign it when you receive it from him and award it to the deserving party at your convenience.

How about each of us make an effort to award at least one certificate a year starting this year!

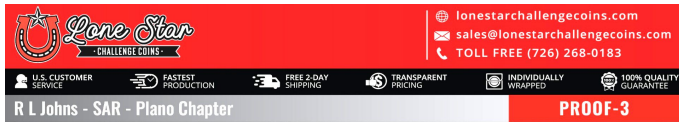

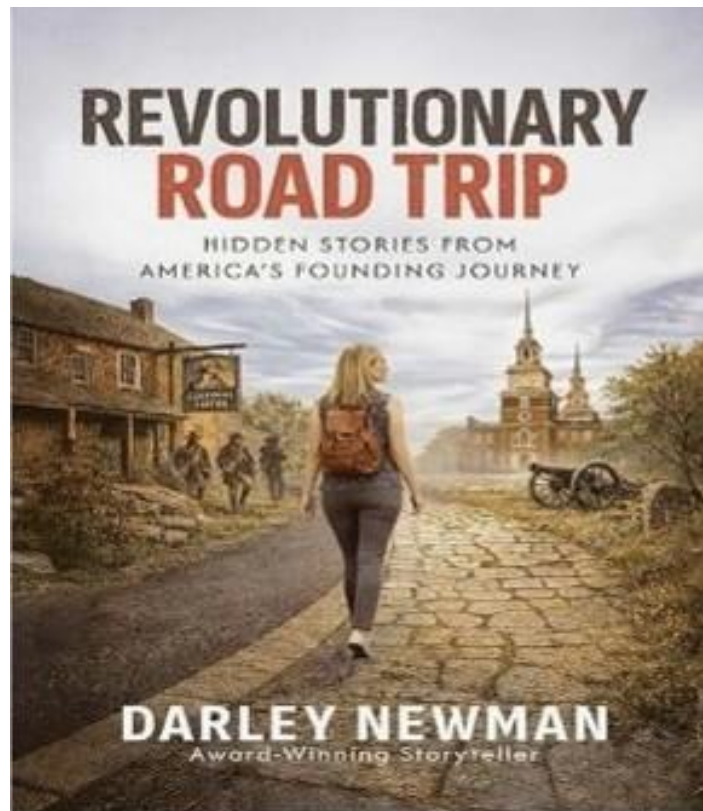

Flag Retirement Ceremony, Plano Fire Station 12

13 June 2026

“We proudly display our flag with honor—and when its service is done, we retire it with the same dignity and respect it has always deserved.”

Today was a beautiful day for the annual Flag Retirement Ceremony at Plano Fire Station #12. The Plano Fire Department and Plano Fire-Rescue Explorer Post 215 hosted members of the Plano and Dallas Chapters of the Sons of the American Revolution and the Mary Shirley McGuire Chapter, Daughters of the American Revolution, for a solemn and respectful ceremony to honor the flag of the United States of America.

The retirement of our nation’s flag is a solemn responsibility and must be carried out with proper respect and dignity. Title 4 of the United States Flag Code reminds us: “The flag, when it is in such condition that it is no longer a fitting emblem for display, should be destroyed in a dignified manner, preferably by burning.”

Dave Fautheree, Plano SAR Color Guard Commander, served as master of ceremonies, with Chaplain Rocky Miller offering the opening and closing prayers. Introductory remarks were given by Shelby Williams, former Plano City Council member, founder of this event and Plano SAR member, and by Plano City Council member Bob Kehr. Following the Pledge of Allegiance, ‘Sekend performed a beautiful rendition of our National Anthem.

Laurie Payton, Chaplain of the Mary Shirley McGuire Chapter, DAR, shared a patriotic reading about our flag. Major General (Ret.) Keith Thurgood, U.S. Army and Plano SAR member, along with Council Member Bob Kehr, served as flag inspectors. Michael Becker, Plano SAR Sergeant-at-Arms, conducted the flag retirement, with members of Explorer Post 215 serving as burn box custodians. Taps was played before the closing prayer and ‘Sekend’s performance of “America the Beautiful.”

Other members of Plano SAR in attendance included Ronald Carey, Roger Hardin, and Gary Coleman.

Patriot Stories

Regarding his Patriot Ancestor
Col. Joseph Crockett**

My patriot, Joseph Crockett, was born in Albemarle County, Virginia in 1742. He received a fairly good education for the period. His father, John Crockett, came to Virginia in the first half of the 18th century. John was a teacher by profession and taught near Charlottesville. Joseph was his oldest son.

In 1774, Joseph served at the battle of Point Pleasant against Natives as a private soldier under Gen. Andrew Lewis. Then, in 1775, the Albemarle County authorities directed that two companies be raised for the defense of the Western section of the State. One of these was to be stationed at Point Pleasant under Gen. William Russell with Joseph as Lieutenant. They were discharged in late 1775 and ordered to raise two new companies for the Continental Army. Joseph was appointed Captain of one of these companies on 5 May 1776. Serving initially in Virginia, the company marched to Philadelphia. Later that year, he was appointed Major and raised two companies for General Daniel Morgan's rifle regiment.

Joseph was serving with General Gates at the surrender of General Burgoyne in 1777 and was engaged in the battles of Brandywine, Princeton and Trenton. took part in the battle of Monmouth on 20 June 1778 and was thereafter promoted to the rank of Lieutenant-Colonel. In October of 1780, the Army was reorganized by Congress and Joseph was reduced in rank to Captain. During his time at Valley Forge, he struck up a warm friendship with General Washington, which lasted the remainder of his life. He was wounded in the arm at the siege of Yorktown.

Joseph moved to Jessamine County, Kentucky in 1784 and settled near the Union Mills. He was instrumental in securing Kentucky's separation from Virginia as a new state.

Colonel Joseph Crockett passed away in October of 1829 at the home of Dr. Bower, his son-in-law. He was buried in the family graveyard at his home in Jessamine County, Kentucky.
