C.A.R. activities focus on patriotism, service, and education about our American heritage.

Sons of the American Revolution Mentor Program

At our February meeting, Art Byrum, the District 7 Vice President, gave a presentation about the Mentor program formulated by the Texas Society SAR.

It is recommended that chapters establish a formal mentorship program where the mentors receive instruction/training prior to being assigned to assist new members.

The new member should be introduced to his member and encouraged to use him as a resource. This introduction should take place when the chapter is informed the new member is registered at National; it need not wait until the installation ceremony.

Ideally, the mentor relationship will continue for a minimum of 4 years.

Robert Rankin plans for Liberty Tree Dedication

Robert Rankin Chapter of the SAR has embarked on a project to commemorate the 250th anniversary of the founding of our country when the "Declaration of Independence" was announced in 1776.

The first of several commemorating goals with our partner, Glenwood Cemetery, involves planting a Liberty Tree, honoring the famous tree in Boston Common under which the patriots met during the early years of the British occupation. It was felled by Loyalists in August of 1775. The deciduous tree we selected goes by the name of swamp maple or Drummond Maple, having three color changes, about 12 feet tall a 30-gallon bucket. It will be delivered by the tree farm and installed this fall by the Cemetery in section G4.

A granite plaque will be installed nearby with appropriate copy.

Another goal is to install a bench with a base, designed for people to sit and admire the serenity in the same G4 area. Etched copy will call out SAR principles and commemoration of the $250^{\rm th}$ anniversary.

Please save the date of April 11, 2026, at 10am at Glenwood cemetery, section G4, for the ceremony and commemoration of our nation's founding presented by our chapter.
