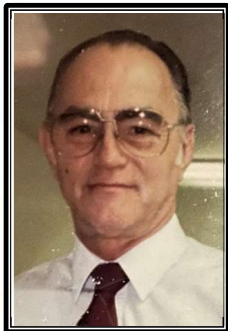


## Member's Corner

### Albert Gallatin - 1931-2025

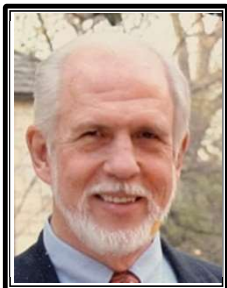


Albert was a past president of the chapter and an SAR member for over 22 years. Born in San Antonio, he graduated from Jefferson High School and graduated from the University of Texas with a degree in Business Administration. After serving two years in the Army after college, he became a Certified Public Accountant owning his practice until his death on January 5, 2025. He was also a past president general of the San Jacinto Descendants, a board member of the San Antonio Genealogical and Historical Society, and won many awards with the Business and Professional Toastmasters.

Albert loved the outdoors and in Boy Scouts, earned the rank of Eagle Scout. He was an avid genealogist and a very active member of the community. He will certainly be missed by his family and friends.

### Thomas M. McNish MD, Col. (Ret) USAF- 1942–2024

Col. McNish was born in Madison, TN. in 1942 and was a 1964 graduate of the USAF Academy. He was inducted into SAR and the chapter in 2018. Tom was a Vietnam War Veteran who flew 45 combat missions in the F-105. Unfortunately, he was shot down in 1966, was captured, and spent 2,373 days as a North Vietnamese POW. Upon his repatriation in 1973, he studied medicine at Emory University School of Medicine and completed residencies in both Family Practice and Aerospace Medicine in 1978.



Dr. McNish completed his distinguished military career as one of the few pilot physicians maintaining currency as both a Flight Surgeon and in the A-10 fighter aircraft. After promotion to Colonel, he served as the Myrtle Beach AFB and Holloman AFB hospital commander. He deployed to Iraq at the end of Desert Storm in 1991 to medically evaluate returning POWs. Col. McNish ended his military career as Command Flight Surgeon for the AF Reserve in the Surgeon General's office at the Pentagon. As a civilian doctor, he was on the team to investigate the Space Shuttle Columbia crash, the September 11th Ft. 93 crash in Pennsylvania, and the Daytona 500 crash that took the life of Dale Earnhardt. Dr. McNish will be missed by the community, SAR, the chapter, and his family.

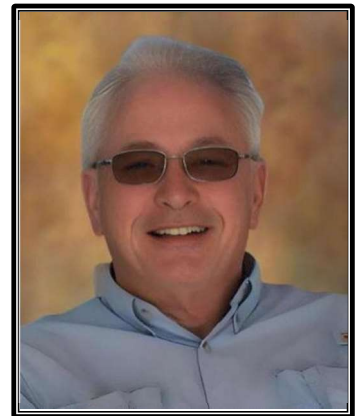
## Member's Corner

### Gala Awards and Recognitions (Cont.)

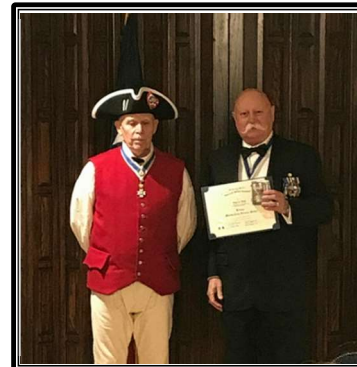

## Proclamation

President George Washington Day  
2025

WHEREAS, the United States of America was established following the War of Revolution from 1776 to 1783, a war won through the brilliant and courageous leadership of George Washington, revered Father of our Nation; and

WHEREAS, George Washington, who lived from 1732 to 1799, mobilized the Continental Army and led the American colonies against the most powerful country in the world, finally defeating the British at the famous battle of York-town, Virginia; and

WHEREAS, this revered founder of our nation resisted the efforts of many supporters to make him a king or dictator, instead using his influence and power to support the creation and adoption of the Constitution of the United States; and

WHEREAS, George Washington was elected as the first President of the United States, serving two terms of office from 1789 to 1797, and through his devotion, wisdom, and vision, became the exemplar of distinguished leadership for all future presidents; and

WHEREAS, the San Antonio Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution wish to encourage all citizens to recognize the epochal contributions of George Washington to our nation by celebrating his birth on Saturday, February 22, 2025.

NOW, THEREFORE I, Stephanie Fisher, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the City of Johnson City, Texas, do hereby proclaim Saturday February 22, 2025, as:

**PRESIDENT GEORGE WASHINGTON DAY**

and call upon all citizens to recognize and honor the brilliance, courage, and vision of the Father of our Nation and the relevance of his life to the preservation of our democracy in today's complex world.

### National Salute to Veterans Events

**Veterans Week** – Each year, the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) conducts a National Salute to Veterans week. The event occurred during the week of February 10-15. This event is dedicated to honor hospitalized and outpatient Veterans who receive healthcare services throughout the Veterans Healthcare System. More than nine million Veterans are cared for each day in VA medical facilities, outpatient clinics, domiciliary sites, and community living centers throughout the U.S. The focus of this event is to “honor and thank veterans for their military service”.

The main event is held at the Audie L. Murphy VA Medical Center. On February 13<sup>th</sup>, Compatriot Frank Rohrbough and two Active Duty Colonels from Brooke Army Medical Center were escorted through the Polytrauma Ward to greet hospitalized veterans. The Chief of Staff for the Medical Center joined the group. Several Veterans were greeted and given Valentine Cards from students from the local Elementary Schools. Compatriot Rohrbough also recognize two of the Veterans who served during the Vietnam War Era and pinned them with the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Commemorative Lapel Pin. Compatriot Rohrbough provided a brief remark about the National Salute to Veterans Program and to personally recognize the veterans for their service.

### 250<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Educational Event:

Honey Creek DAR Chapter along with 13 students ranging from age five to twelve years old met at the Mammen Public Library, Bulverde TX on February 15<sup>th</sup>. Compatriots Peter Baron and Frank Rohrbough represented SAR and also attended the educational event to remember the 250<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the American Revolution. The program began with a 15-minute reading session covering events of the American Revolution. Other presentations included a discussion of historical books of events of the Revolutionary War and the supporting roles of France and Spain.

Compatriots Baron and Rohrbough provided a demonstration table of weapons and camp gear used by the soldiers of the Continental Army and Colonial Militias. Compatriot Baron presented a program describing the various flags of the Revolution to include representative flags used by General Washington at his Boston HQs and the US Flag designed by Betsy Ross in 1781.

Compatriot Baron demonstrated musket firing. He explained the loading and firing sequence for a musket and then described the use of the weapons when the Army was engaged with the enemy. Compatriot Rohrbough provided coloring books to the children depicting colonial life, attire, camp gear, weapons and historical events of the Revolution. The students thoroughly enjoyed the 2-hour presentation.

Dan Farris provided an interesting Vignette on The Battle of Bunker Hill, which was a significant American Revolutionary War early battle fought on June 17, 1775. The battle occurred during the siege of Boston, a few months after the Battles of Lexington and Concord, which marked the beginning of the war. As pointed out, the battle was a British victory with the British taking the hill, however, it was a morale booster for the American forces demonstrating that the colonists could stand up to the British army. The battle also pointed out the need for better training, organization, and supplies.

## Miscellaneous



### The Whiskey Rebellion

The Distilled Spirits excise tax and the Whiskey Rebellion played an integral role in the formation of our current tax system. Compromises between the 13 states and Federal Government were required in order to adopt the first U.S. Constitution in 1789. The major disagreement was how to pay the national debt from the Revolutionary War. At the urging of the first Secretary of the Treasury, Alexander Hamilton, and not envisioning the abject rejection of the western frontiersmen, Congress used its authority to "lay and collect Taxes, Duties, Imposts and Excises" and established the first nationwide internal revenue tax, called the "Distilled Spirits Tax" in 1791. Unlike tariffs on imported goods, the excise tax was a direct tax on American products. The tax was set at six to 18-cents per gallon and was structured such that smaller distillers often paid more than twice per gallon than larger producers.



Still, had to be registered and failing to pay their taxes, distillers had to appear in Federal court. The government had little success in collecting the whiskey tax throughout the Western frontier. Many small distillers refused to pay the tax and others took violent stands in opposition. Local tax rebels tarred and feathered tax collectors and threatened or beat those offering the collectors offices or housing. Because of the threats and violence, Federal tax officials were never appointed in many western counties.

Despite the President's pleas and Congressional actions to modify the tax law, violence and political opposition to the whiskey tax continued to grow during the next two

years. In October 1794, a Federalized militia, led by Pres. Washington, was dispatched to put down the rebellion. Opponents of internal taxes supported Thomas Jefferson helping him defeat President Adams. In 1802, Congress repealed the distilled spirits excise tax and until the War of 1812, the Federal government would rely solely on import tariffs for revenue, which quickly grew with the Nation's expanding foreign trade.

In the end, the Whiskey Rebellion served as one of the first tests of the new Constitution and the Federal government's authority. It was also the greatest domestic crisis of President Washington's administration. The successful suppression of the Whiskey Rebellion helped to confirm the supremacy of Federal law in the early United States and the right of Congress to levy and collect taxes on a nation-wide basis.
