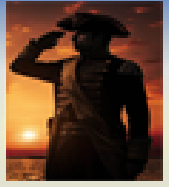

Member's Corner

Your help is requested.

Each year, the Chapter is required to send a report, called the Americanism Report, to SAR National Headquarters. The report is a detailed statistical report on the chapter's activities for the year. The report gathers statistics in 12 areas as described below:

1. **Media Publicity:** All print, on-line, TV, radio, articles that specifically mention SAR.
2. **Special Observances:** Patriotic holiday celebrations, parades, Wreaths Across America (regardless from whom the Wreaths are purchased), visitation to a historic site, and patriotic special observances
3. **Joint activities with DAR and/or CAR**
4. **Youth Contests:** There are numerous contests such as posters, brochures, essays, orations, and Eagle Scout, and JROTC for various school age students. If you sponsor or participate in any of these in any capacity, please report the (see below).
5. **Awards:** Any SAR or non-SAR patriotic, citizenship, public service awards might qualify for listing. Please report if in doubt.
6. **Chapter Meetings:** While regular Chapter Meetings do not count in and of themselves, any SAR/DAR/CAR gathering or event that is more than just a business meeting, can be counted.
7. **Grave Marking:** Participating in grave marking of a patriot or deceased member of SAR is reportable.
8. **Color Guard Activities:** Report any function where members attend in colonial attire.
9. **Public Appearances:** Public office, historical/educational/patriotic presentation to most any audience, helping veterans or veterans' groups, flag honors, and citizenship ceremonies are reportable.
10. **Attendance at SAR meetings above the Chapter level:** Attending State, District or National SAR conferences, conventions, or committee meetings.
11. **Contributions:** Please report any donations to SAR, cash, bequest or non-cash. Additionally, donations to veterans groups or groups supporting veterans, such as the USO are reportable.
12. **Membership:** Chapter membership conducted by the chapter or at the State level.

Please take a moment and email the 1st Vice President

<https://www.texassar.org/SanAntonio/officers.htm> a simple report describing any of the above activities you participated in so the chapter can be credited for its activities. In your report, please include the "who, what, when, and where."

If in doubt, report any activity you think might qualify and let those responsible for the report decide if eligible. The information is only used for the Americanism Report and not shared with anyone but the State and National SAR organizations. Contact the 1st Vice president (above) if you have questions.



Member's Corner

Rest in Peace: Colonel Barent Dutcher ("Dutch"), a chapter member for over 65 years, passed away on August 7, 2025 at the age of 93 years old. "Dutch" was the longest tenured chapter member and 3rd longest in the state society. Dutch came from a military family and experienced a life rich in travel. His lifelong commitment to his country and military service was unwavering. He graduated from Texas A&M University and was commissioned into the U.S. Air Force.

Colonel Dutcher was a highly decorated senior officer being awarded numerous medals to include the Legion of Merit that is awarded for exceptionally meritorious conduct or achievement in the performance of outstanding services, typically for senior officers in significant leadership roles, and recognized for actions that far exceed normal duties.

Dutch enjoyed big game hunting while stationed in Alaska and prized a large set of moose antlers displayed in his home. He had a lifelong passion for numismatics (coin collecting) and particularly enjoyed sharing his extensive knowledge and collection to friends and other collectors. In his later years, he became very interested in genealogy and researching his family. He had managed to chart his family back to the 13th century.

Rest in peace Colonel Dutcher. You will be missed by your SAR friends and your family.

Gala Keynote Speaker: Judge Fred Biery, Federal District Judge-Western District of Texas, was the guest speaker for the Gala. Judge Biery has a very impressive resume and gave a very inspiring presentation on "Remembering and Defending Our Founding Principles - Then and Now".

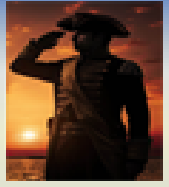
He earned his law degree in 1973 and practiced law in private practice until being elected County Court Judge in 1979. He was elected Judge, 150th District Court in 1983 and served until 1993 when he was nominated by President Clinton to the bench of the Federal District Court, Western District of Texas. He has tried thousands of both criminal and civil cases and continues to serve today. Judge Biery served in the Army Reserve from 1970-1976. He has two daughters and two granddaughters. Judge Biery was awarded the SAR Silver Good Citizenship Medal by State President Mel Oller.

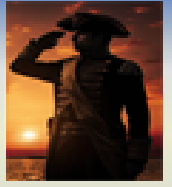

This was the 6th year for the reading of the proclamation, an event enjoyed by many city officials and residents.



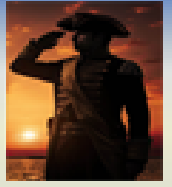

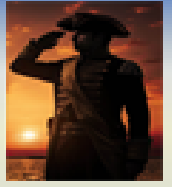
Pike Davis Ranch: On a cold 22 degree morning on January 31, 2026, five SAR chapter members braved the cold along with about 100 boy scouts from seven different troops to provide numerous presentations on “Old Glory”, Genealogy, the American Revolution, and musket demonstrations and firing for the annual Scouting America (BSA) homecoming campout at the historic Pike Davis Ranch in Round Mountain, Texas. The Ranch consists of nearly 1500 acres and has been in the hands of one family since 1854. The ranch is permanently protected under a conservation easement with Texas Land Conservancy. The ranch is a working cattle ranch owned by the Howard Hicks and Bettie Green families. These families are dedicated to conservation and work tirelessly to protect and restore the environment and its native wildlife.

The hard work of Peter and Campbell Baron made this chapter event possible. In addition to presentations, there were three exhibit tables providing scouts an opportunity to handle replicas of Revolutionary War period weapons and everyday items. The event was very well received by the scouts.

The chapter conducts these mini-receptions a couple times a year and it is always rewarding to those of us who attend. 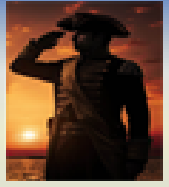

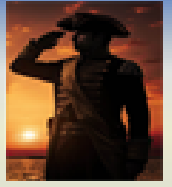

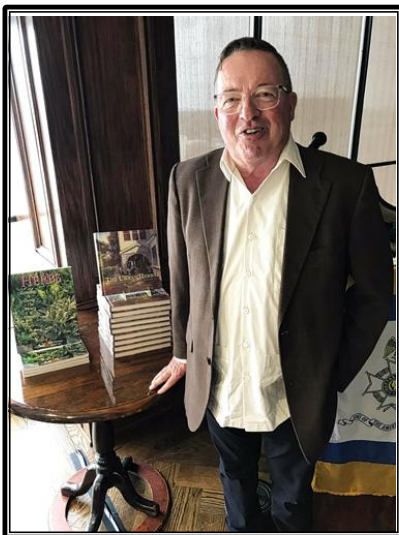

Guest Speaker: The chapter was honored to have Mr. William (Bill) Varney, author, chef, and gardener. Mr. Varney, who has spent years growing and cooking with herbs, spoke to us on the “Urban Herbal and Herbs During the American Revolution.” Mr. Varney was the owner of an herbal farm and restaurant in Fredericksburg for many years. When he sold his restaurant and moved to San Antonio, he opened a new restaurant. Mr. Varney has won many awards for his books and restaurants specializing in the growing and use of herbs. His presentation on the many herbs available and their use and benefits was most interesting. He also traveled throughout Europe and discovered the ancient Greeks of Rome used herbs for medicine, cooking, and soothing oils and creams for hundreds of years BC. The colonists also used herbs for many of the same uses after settling in what was to become America. Mr. Varney has published two very popular books that describe the growing of herbs and many recipes for their use. His business is “URBANherbal Body, Bath, Beauty, Culinary, Aromatherapy, Gifts, Plants and Landscape” located at 137 E Woodlawn Ave, San Antonio, TX 78212. A Famous Warship

USS Bonhomme Richard: Because of its iconic naval battles, the USS Bonhomme Richard is said to be the most famous battleship of the Revolutionary war. It was a 42 gun frigate commanded by John Paul Jones. Not really a battleship because true battleships were much heavier and more heavily armored. The Bonhomme was actually a frigate class war ship.

One such immense battle occurred on September 23rd, 1779 off the coast of England during the Battle of Flamborough. The Bonhomme Richard engaged the far superior British frigate, USS Serapis, which was a 44 gun frigate in a very close quarters fight that lasted over three hours. Despite heavy damage, on board fires, and the ship sinking, Jones refused to surrender. It was from this battle that after the British Captain of the HMS Serapis demanded Jones strike his colors (surrender) , that Jones defiantly said, “I have not yet begun to fight!”

Jones’s crew somehow managed to board and capture the crew of the Serapis even though the Bonhomme sank. This battle strengthened the overall resolve of the American morale and highlighted the effectiveness of the young Continental Navy. The USS Bonhomme Richard stands out as the most celebrated and famous “battleships” in Naval memory.

Other notable ships from the Colonial era include:

- Early Continental Navy vessels like the USS Alfred (the first commissioned American warship in 1775, with John Paul Jones serving as lieutenant).
- French warships, such as those in the Battle of the Chesapeake (1781), which were decisive in trapping British forces at Yorktown.

British ships-of-the-line and frigates dominated overall naval power, but none match the Bonhomme Richard's fame in American history.

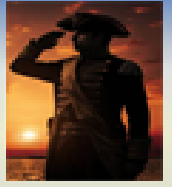
