THE DECLARATION STATES ALL MENARE CREATED EQUALAND ENDOWED BY THEIR CREATORTO CERTAIN LEAD TO REBELLION, AND UNALIENA BLERIGHTS, THAT A MONGTHESE ARELIFE LIBERTY, AND THE PUR SULT OF HAPPINESS, "WHICH SO CLEARLY SHOWS THE TRUE AMERICAN WAY. THIS QUOTE AND MANYMORE SET UPTHEWAY WE LIVE TO DAY AMONGTHE 56 SIGNERS, THEY KNEW THE DANGERS OF THESE TIONS WERE CONSIDERED EASONOUS ... AND THE PUNISHMENT PANKLIN SO DIRECTLY PUT IT, VE MUST ALLHANG TO GETHER OR E MOST ASSUREDLY WILL HANG PARATELY... AS HE INSERTED HIS SIGNATURE. · FOR SO LONG, THESE MEN HAD WAITED FOR SUCH A DAY, A BAY OF FREEDOM. AND AFTER SUCH AN OPPRESSION. IT IS HARD TO BELIEVE THE COLONISTS WOULDN'T TAKE THE OPPORTUNITY OF INDEPENDENCE. I WOULD HAVE WHOLEHEARTEDLY SIGNED MY NAME IN INK AND BLOOD OTHER PATRIOTS AMONG ALL ONTHAT JULY DAY IN 1776. THOSE SAME PRINCIPLES COME TO MY MIND EVEN NOW.

OUR DECLARATION INSPIRED THE FRENCH AND SPANISH SUPPORT FOR OUR REVOLUTIONARY WAR EFFORTS. IT ALSO LIT THE FLAME FOR SO MANY DEMOCRACIES TO COME.
