# Officer Training For Typical SAR Chapter

## Chapter Vice President

- Presides over the chapter in the absence of the President
- Assist the President in carrying out his duties
- Assist in the planning, location selection, and agenda of Chapter meetings and events.
- Administers the training program for members
  - Conducts SAR fundamentals training of new members, issues the New Member Guidebook, and assigns a Mentor.
  - Works with the District Vice President on Chapter training initiatives
  - Conducts the training of Mentors and Chapter Officers
- Chairs the Awards, Planning & Budget, and Membership Committees
- Attends Chapter Meetings

## OFFICER TRAINING IS:

- **This Training is designed for “Traditional” Officer Structure**
- **Officer Structure may be Different for each Chapter**
  - May have different ways they function (Titles, Roles, Duties etc.)
  - Chapter should do what works best for them!

## Secretary

- Conducts general correspondence of the Chapter
- Records, publishes and maintains a permanent copy of the Chapter meeting minutes.
- Assist the President in preparing the Chapter BOM and Annual Meeting reports to the State Secretary
- Maintains Chapter files, such as:
  - rosters
  - new members
  - deceased members
  - correspondence
  - membership information

## Secretary

- Trains Members to update their personal information using online forms for Texas and National SAR websites
- Responsible to work with State Secretary for Chapter transfers and reinstatements, using appropriate forms.
- Works with the Treasurer on the completion and submittal of the Annual Reconciliation Report
- Notifies State Secretary of the death, resignation or removal of any member
- Report change of Officers to State and National, using appropriate forms
- Attends Chapter Meetings

## Treasurer

- Annually by May 15, submits online the IRS 990-N form to maintain the Chapters non-profit status
- Assist with the annual financial review/audit of records
- Maintains current email address of all members
- Attends Chapter Meetings

## Treasurer

- Keeps accurate account of receipts and expenditures
- Maintains a finance system capable of:
  - Receiving and securing income
  - Dispersing funds to pay expenses
  - Reporting on the financial status of the Chapter
- Receives Chapter income including member dues/ Dual Members
- Pays all expenses authorized by the President, per the approved budget, and/or voted on by the members
- Works with President/Officers in developing budget

## Registrar

- Receives and reviews new and supplemental applications for:
  - Fee is included
  - Application is complete and properly prepared
  - All dates are present and in the correct format
  - Applicant and sponsor have signed
  - All proof documents are present, appear authentic, and are appropriately marked-up in red pencil
- Inputs data into on-line application for the applicant
- Forwards the application, proof and fee to the State Registrar
- Performs duties of Genealogist if Chapter does not have one
- Attends Chapter Meetings

## Genealogist/Assistant Registrar

- Conducts genealogical workshops
- Assist potential applicants for membership in preparing their membership applications
- Assist Registrar in reviewing new and supplemental applications by:
  - Helping with a challenging family tree connection to a Patriot Ancestor
  - Finding authentic proof of generational levels
  - Referred proof is present and appears authentic
- Acts as Registrar in his absence
- Attends Chapter Meetings

## Chaplain

- Leads the Invocation and Benediction at Chapter meetings and events
- Sends a sympathy card to the family members of deceased Compatriots
- Attends Chapter Meetings

## Historian/Yearbook

- Records all significant events/activities of the Chapter each year in the Chapter's Yearbook
- Records a 1-2 page history of the Chapter's events/activities each year including such items as:
  - Chapter Officers
  - Grave Markings
  - Color Guard activities
  - Significant Chapter Meetings (officer installation, inductions, and banquets)
  - Chapter and individual awards
- Attends Chapter Meetings

## Webmaster

- Maintain Chapter Website
- Post updates, news articles, pictures, and events pertaining to the Chapter to the Chapters homepage and social media outlets
- Attends Chapter Meetings

## Color Guard Commander

- Coordinates and leads local Color Guard (CG) activities per standard operating procedures per Color Guard Handbook
- Inspects uniforms and equipment of CG members and conducts weapons safety checks prior to events
- Maintains the Chapters flags, stands, and other CG equipment
- Maintains a log of Chapter members for presentation of the Bronze CG Medal and as a backup to Americanism Report submitted annually
- Verifies reimbursement (if any) for CG participants.
- Attends Chapter Meetings

## Sargent-at-Arms

- Chairs the Chapters Flag Committee responsible for awarding Flag Certificates
- Responsible for maintaining order and civility at Chapter meetings
- Ensures Roberts Rules of Order are followed
- Keep, store and maintain the assets (flags, poles, stands, electronics)
- Meets and greets members and guest as they enter the meeting, and secures the door if necessary
- Attends Chapter Meetings

## Sargent-At-arms

- Takes care that all flags, awards, and signs are properly displayed at all regular and special meetings of the Chapter
- Should have a copy of "Flag Protocol" available on the proper care, handling, and display of the American Flag
- Have care and custody of the Chapter's Charter and see that it is available when needed by the Chapter
- Sees that badges are prepared for use by members
- Represents Chapter in the Community where SAR is invited to participate in a "massing of the colors"

## Chancellor

- Should be an Attorney
- Should give opinions on legal matters affecting the Chapter
- Acts as Parliamentarian at all meetings
- Works with the State Chanellor
- Attends Chapter Meetings

## Committee Chairmen

- Sets and holds regular Committee Meetings
- Leads the Committee meeting
- Sets the agenda for the meeting
- Ensures minutes are taken, and a written copy kept for reporting purposes
- Reports on committee activities at Chapter meetings
- Attends Chapter Meetings

## All Officers Duty (Recommendations)

- Educate Chapter Members on the SAR and its programs
- Get Members engaged early in committee activities and delegate responsibilities/jobs
- Train and mentor your assistants – develop your replacements!
- Encourage Members to acquire a Revolutionary War/Militia uniform and participate in Color Guard activities/events
- Recognize and award Chapter Members
- Develop and encourage a strong speakers program at chapter meetings that expands our knowledge of the Revolutionary War and Patriot Ancestors
- Conduct fundraising and donation opportunities to provide the chapter sufficient resources to execute SAR programs.

Bill was the TXDAR State Winner of the 2017 Outstanding Teacher of US History Award.

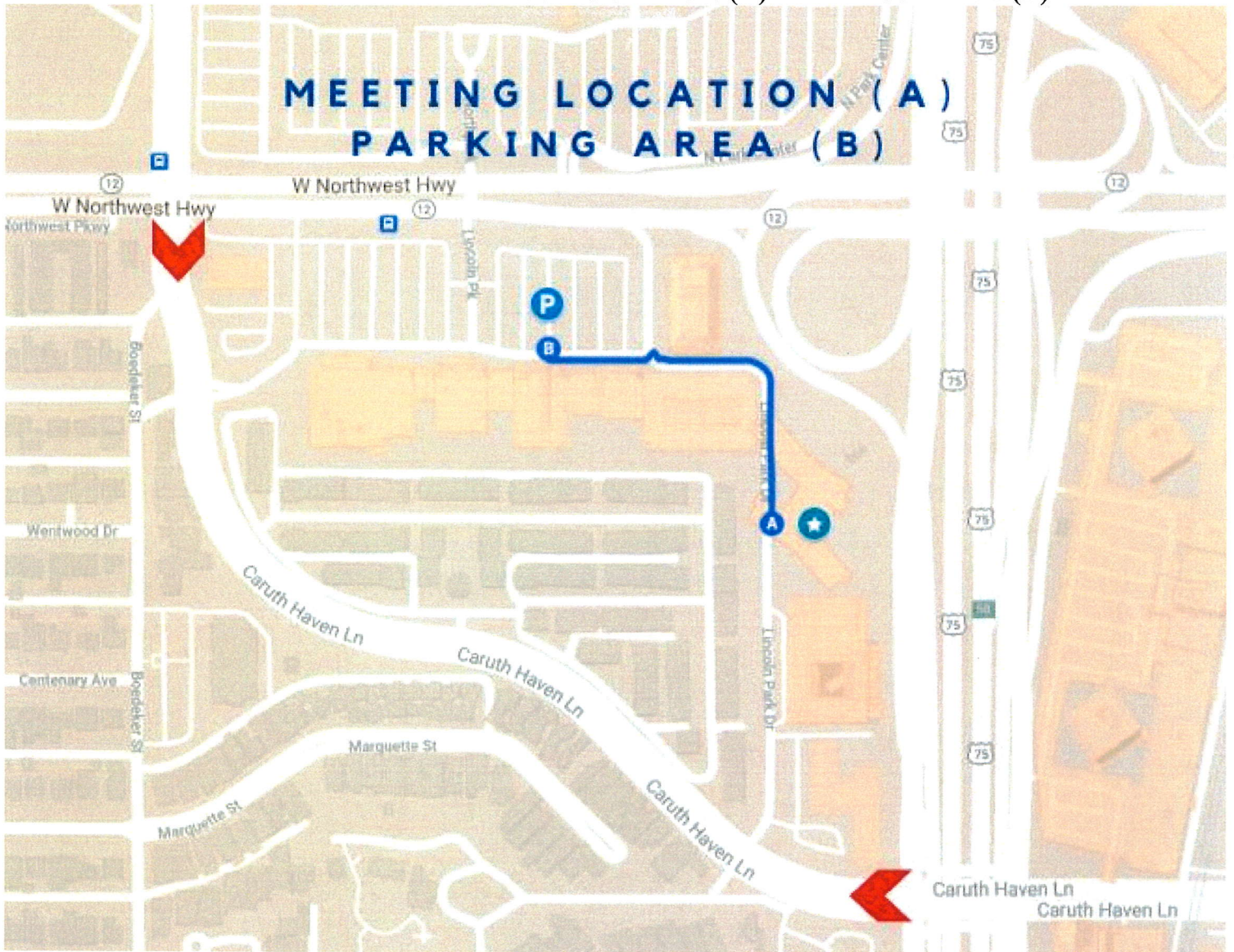

**DIRECTIONS TO LOCATION MEETING LOCATION (A) PARKING AREA (B)**





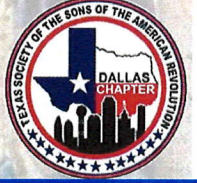

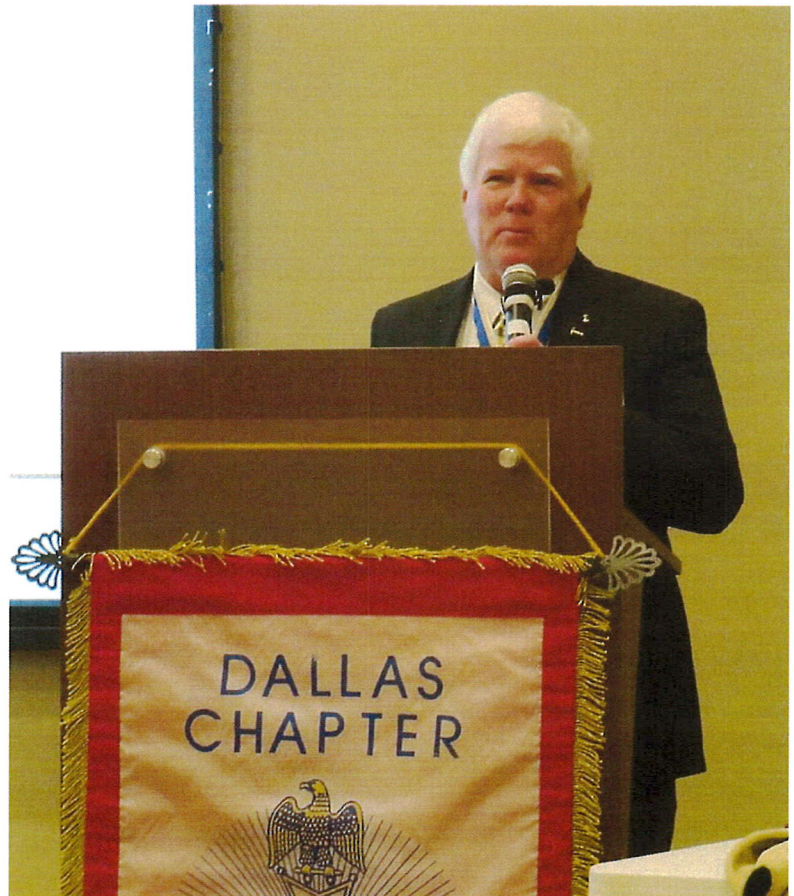

## **“The Bad Girls of the American Revolution.”**



This 1852 painting by Emanuel Leutz shows Catherine Schuyler, wife of General Philip Schuyler, burning the family wheat fields to prevent the British obtaining the field to feed their troops.



Abigail Adams wrote urging her husband her husband John Adams to “remember the ladies” when forming the new laws of the republic.

In 1776 Abigail inoculated herself and her children against smallpox. She also took care of the family farm while John was away.

John wrote to her, “I know not what would become of me, and mine, if I had not such a Friend to take Care of my Interests in my absence,” – 1777.

Martha Washington followed her husband on his campaigns during the Revolutionary War. She was at his side and when away she wrote to him.

When her husband died she was asked to publish her letters to George. She decided they were between husband and wife and burned them rather than have them published.



Nancy Ann Morgan Hart a Georgia frontierswoman and staunch Patriot became a legend for her courageous stand against Loyalists.

Represented in this painting from National Geographic depicts Nancy defending herself against a group of Loyalists who barged into her home.

She captured them and held them captive until help arrived to take them away.

These are just a few of the women that Bill Covington talked about at our chapter meeting.

Bill Watts presented three CAR members with the Dallas Chapter Challenge coins for children.

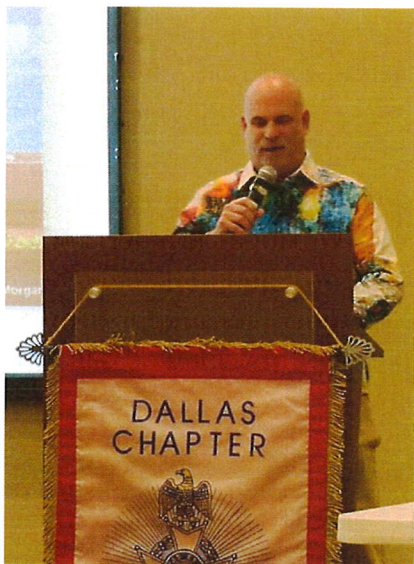
